Cherished wife, loving mother, adored grandmother and great-grandmother, fiercely loyal friend and beloved by all who knew her, Mary Eileen Morri — known as Eileen — passed peacefully on Thursday, July 2, 2026, surrounded by her loving family and friends. Her remarkable 100 years were defined by unwavering strength, deep devotion to her family and steadfast Catholic faith.

Eileen was born April 26, 1926, in Brooklyn, New York, to Charles and Bertha Pendrell. She spent her childhood in Woodhaven, New York, before moving with her family to Richmond, California, at age 17, where she graduated from Richmond Union High School. Unbeknownst to her at the time, she had already crossed paths with the man who would become the love of her life.

Always a New Yorker at heart, Eileen returned to New York after high school. Blessed with natural beauty and grace, she worked as a fashion model for Mademoiselle magazine and recorded several songs, including a beautiful rendition of "The Chapel of St. Cecilia."

Longing to be closer to family, Eileen returned to California in 1947 and began working at Bank of America in Oakland. She reconnected with Stan Morri, and their friendship blossomed into a lifelong love. They were married in 1952 and made their home in El Cerrito before moving to Fresno in 1963 and then to Tracy in 1970.

Together, Eileen and Stan built Stan Morri Ford into one of Tracy's most respected and trusted family businesses. Following the sale of the dealership in 2010, they embraced retirement, cherishing the many friendships they had cultivated over the decades. Eileen also delighted in traveling the world with a close-knit group of lifelong friends.

A woman of generous spirit, Eileen dedicated countless hours to serving both her community and her church. She volunteered with the Children's Home Society, the PTA and as a Girl Scout troop leader. She was a long-time member of the Italian Catholic Federation and St. Bernard's Catholic Church, where she joyfully sang in the choir.

Eileen treasured every holiday season, especially Christmas. Her beautifully decorated tree often remained standing long after the season had passed — much to the amusement of those who loved her.

Her greatest joy was her family, and her legacy lives on through the generations she nurtured with boundless love.

Eileen was preceded in death by her parents; her brother, Donald; and her beloved husband of 73 years, Stan Morri.
