

That mission became Brighter Christmas, which has supported over 27,500 local families over



the last 45 years. Gene considered this one of his greatest accomplishments — an effort he always credited to the dedication of hundreds of volunteers and the generosity of the Tracy community.

Gene is survived by his beloved wife of 30 years, Karen Birk and their sweet pup, Cookie. As well as his children: Sheri Dentone (Bud), Cindy Schock (Greg), and Rodney Birk (Linda), as well as two bonus children, Matthew and Sean Atkinson. Gene's legacy continues through his seven grandchildren, four bonus-grandchildren, thirteen great-grandchildren,
