PHOENIX, April 6.—(AP)—The fifteenth Arizona legislative session, opening in special session today, was asked by Governor Osborn today to enact laws to protect the Arizona people against the war-time stamp and hold its faith in Almighty God.

In a 46-minute address to a solemn joint meeting of the senate and house of the legislature, the governor appealed for unity of purpose in the work of the session.

The extraordinary meeting—called an "special session" by the governor—appropriately opened on Tuesday, April 6, with the reading of the opening prayer by Rev. J. J. Conroy, pastor of St. Ignace church.
