Regarding the Knights of the Ku Klux Klan in this country, George S. Kitt, president of the Kiwanis club of Tucson, says that he feels there is very little need of such an organization since, generally speaking, the citizens of the United States are peaceable, law-abiding residents.

"From all that I can gather of the Ku Klux Klan, in reading and observation of the moves in other states, they are overstepping their privilege as citizens in taking the law into their own hands," said Mr. Kitt yesterday.

"We have not come to that stage of demoralization, as far as I can see, when we cannot leave the making of laws to those whose motives and ideals are for peace and protection.
