
## Migrant deaths and border walls in 2021

Roughly two-thirds of Arizona's 370-mile border with Mexico has border wall or pedestrian fencing. One of the areas without these barriers, the Tohono O'odham Nation, had more remains recovered so far in 2021 than any other cross-border corridor. The remains of 78 migrants were found on the eastern portion of the tribal nation and seven on the western portion as of September. The Tohono O'odham Nation has seen far more recovered remains than any other area since 2000.
