## REDEEMED LIVES LIST—BIGGEST BOAT SALVAGE

### TITANIC, WHITE STAR LINER HITS ICEBERG 2,200 ON BOARD: 675 KNOWN SAVED GREATEST MARINE FATALITY IN HISTORY

### WOMEN AND CHILDREN SAVED SPELLS DOOM OF ALL MALES

The Carpathia Arriving to Aid Stricken Boat Finds Lifeboats Laden With Humanity But Only Bits of Wreckage of Tote of \$10,000,000 Floating Palace and Its Cargo of Living Freight: 740 Third-Class Voyagers; Officials Still Hopeful.

More than 1500 persons it is feared to have died early yesterday when within four hours after she crashed into an iceberg, the mammoth White Star liner Titanic, from Liverpool to New York on her maiden voyage, was torn to the bottom of the New England banks. Of the 2200 persons on board, some of yesterday's prominent ones, the White Star officials in New York, while keeping by hope to the last, freely admitted there had been "a horrible loss of life."

**Greatest Marine Accident.** According to the early estimates of the marine loss in this history, the disaster is the greatest in maritime history. The vessel, approaching it in magnitude was the disaster of the steamer Atlantic in 1873 when 647 lives were lost, and the *Northampton* in 1881 when 300 lives of 571, showed it proved that other liners, including the *Titanic*, have taken off safely. The men were mostly men, but the women and children were saved. It is estimated that a few remained of the world had news to come.
