Valuable Securities and Bonds Were Stolen From Mail Truck in St. Louis

St. Louis, Mo., April 19.—Two million dollars worth of bonds and securities included in the loot taken in the holdup of an armored mail truck here April 2, were recovered late today in a case in St. Louis county, several miles west of the city.

The loot was recovered in the home of William F. Diering and in addition to the bonds and securities, postoffice inspectors and county officials found a large quantity of cash and a barrel said to contain clothing and other articles.

A letter of William F. Diering, a local banker, to the St. Louis federal bank, to the effect that he had recovered the loot, was taken by the postoffice inspectors.
