One of the major changes occurred in the master bedroom.

The walls are a grayed-olive, and the gauze draperies are of the same color. The print used in the duster and chaise is white with flowers in apricot, olive and bronze.

Because the room is so large, the furniture has been arranged in two groupings, both with large sofas. One, near the fireplace, is burnt bronze, black and brown tweed. Across the room near the floor-to-ceiling windows is another sofa in beige. One wall of the room is glassed and opens to the terrace and grassy patio.
