ARMS MEETING DELEGATES ARE SET FOR WORK

Busy Day Prepares London Group for Serious Labor Today
SCHEDULES ARE FULL

LONDON, Jan. 22.—The American, British, French, Italian and Japanese delegates to the five power arms conference today in the first exchange of views before the first plenary meeting at St. James palace conference rooming when the first delegate was to outline the general armament proposals.

Mr. Gwynne covered a general meeting of the American delegation at ten a. m., which lasted for two hours, and then called on Mr. MacDonald at number 10 Downing street, before going to lunch.

There was a tremendous crowd of people gathered in the streets of London to see the delegates as they left the city for the conference.

During the night Mr. MacDonald talked with the delegates from the British delegation, and they did not have twenty minutes to discuss the day's work.
