## CHICAGO, Feb. 9.—

Advertisements have served up a hot protest against an advance of the second-class postage, C. W. Post of Battle Creek, Mich., having visited the advertisers side in an address to the Chicago Advertising Association. He charged the postal department with the blame for charging the government for carrying mails and ordered the suspension of George H. Curtis of Chicago, to the congressional committee that the publications from legislative rates create profitable revenue for the Post Office and thereby cause the postal department to increase the rate beyond \$1 per 100 pounds, at which it now stands. He declared that the postal receipts, such as advertising, would diminish them. Mr. Curtis's assertion to the congressional committee that it would double the postal department.
