Both Maxwell Drivers Duplicate Non-Stop Performance in 100-Mile Race Christening New Speedway at the Fair Grounds; Time 1:31:59

DELNO DROVE MOCH AT THRILLING PACE

Winner's Percentage Time for the 103.152 Miles Was 67 Miles an Hour; Fastest Time on Second Lap, Was 72 Miles

Duplicating their performance at Venice last Wednesday, the two famous speed kings, Barney Oldfield and John Carlson, brought a 100-mile race over the new Tucson speedway yesterday afternoon and again the old driver came out victor by a narrow margin. Time 1:31:59.

The fastest lap in the race was made by Oldfield when he averaged the 43 miles an hour in 3 minutes and 22 seconds, whereas the second lap was made by Carlson at 47.28 miles an hour.

Not a semblance of an accident marred the race and less than 100 people watched the event. There were 200 in the grandstands and 1,000 around the fair grounds.

The race was won by Oldfield, who finished in 1:31:59, with Carlson second in 1:32:15 and Delno third in 1:33:00.
