William J. Wong, 65

William "Lema" June Wong, a lifelong resident of Flagstaff died Aug. 27. He was 65.

Mr. Wong was born Aug. 31, 1921, in Flagstaff.

In World War II, Mr. Wong enlisted with the U.S. Air Force and was a first lieutenant bombardier. He began his tour of service on B-24s in the South Pacific. After more than 50 missions, Mr. Wong returned to start Air Force pilot training. Prior to graduation, the war ended and he returned to Flagstaff.

Mr. Wong then enrolled in upholstery school in Los Angeles. He later returned home as Flagstaff's first furniture upholsterer, where he and his brother, Bob, started June Furniture Co. on South San Francisco Street.

In 1948, Mr. Wong married Margaret Ban, Tucson. Together they founded the present Junes Custom House interior decorators.

Survivors include his wife, Margaret, Flagstaff; two sons, Stephen, Flagstaff; Justin, Tucson; a daughter, Judy Lee, Tucson; two grandsons; three brothers, Bob June, Alameda, Calif.; Jack June, Garden Grove, Calif.; James Wong, Tucson; three sisters, Margaret Low, Oakland, Calif.; Edith Warren, Scottsdale; Marjorie Ngou, Canoga Park, Calif.; and numerous nieces and nephews.
