U. S. Troops In Russia Told To Pack For Front, American Soldiers Balk, Demand Return To U. S.

Washington, April 10.—The war department today issued orders that the progress of a message from the American commander at Archangel, dated March 11, respecting the refusal of a company of infantry, stationed at the front line until further instructions had been received from Washington as to when the American troops would be withdrawn from Russia.

Unemployment In U. S. Is on Increase, Weekly Federal Report Reveals

Washington, April 10.—Increasing unemployment during the week ending April 6, was shown in reports from all states published today by the bureau of labor statistics. The weekly report shows a total labor surplus of 1,128,000, an increase of 100,000 over the preceding week, while it reported a further average increase of 100,000 and a decrease in the number of persons employed in agriculture.
