

NEW RULES FOR BLACKOUT GIVEN

Owners of Lighted Signs Must Have Someone to Turn Them Off

Additional instructions and plans for Tucson's first practice blackout were announced yesterday by Phil J. Martin Jr., coordinator of the municipal defense council of the city of Tucson.

Under title of official order No. 2, the following was posted yesterday:

Rule On Signs

"Effective at sunset as of the 13th day of December, 1941, no illuminated exterior signs or lights in the city of Tucson shall remain lighted between sunset and sunrise unless attended by some person who can and shall extinguish the same immediately in the event of a blackout order."

Martin said yesterday that in event of a blackout, all automobiles are to pull over to the side of the street or road and extinguish their lights and keep them extinguished until the all-clear signal is sounded.

Blue Car Lights

Official cars will be equipped with blue lights. In case it is necessary for some cars other than official cars to move, they will be escorted by official cars.

The appointment of Gladstone Mackenzie, clerk of the county board of supervisors, as chief deputy coordinator for Tucson, completed the organization of top coordinators in Tucson and vicinity. Ora Shinn holds a similar position in South Tucson.
