

## Albert K. Ludy

Albert K. Ludy, a native of Philadelphia and nationally known geodetic authority, died Saturday at his home in Denver, Colo., after a three-month illness. He was 68.

Mr. Ludy had lived in Denver since retiring from the U. S. Coast and Geodetic Survey. He spent 23 years in Government service in charge of magnetic observatories at Sitka, Alaska; Tucson, Ariz., and Cheltenham, Md. From 1942 to 1944 he was chief of the section of geomagnetism.

Surviving are his wife, the former Ethel Albrecht, of Philadelphia; six children and 10 great-grandchildren.
