
T'S TERRITORIAL UA-ASU RIVALRY A FIERCE ONE

THE '70s: RIVALS FROM WAC TO PAC



H. DARR BEISER / TUCSON CITIZEN 1979 **1979:** The Wildcats beat ASU only twice the entire decade, but they ended the 1970s with a 27-24 win in Tempe. The 1979 win came in the second year of Pac-10 play for both schools, and was the first time UA beat its rival in the new league.



1975: With a Fiesta Bowl berth on the line for the winner, 10-0 ASU beat 9-1 Arizona 24-21 thanks to "The Catch" by Sun Devils' receiver John Jefferson. Wildcats fans claim the controversial catch shouldn't have counted, and that Jefferson didn't land inbounds on his first-half touchdown. The Sun Devils finished 12-0 and ranked No. 2 in the country, while UA finished 9-2 with no bowl.






WILDCATS, SUN DEVILS FIELDED SOME OF THEIR BEST TEAMS IN '90s

Dick Tomey and Bruce Snyder left their respective programs at the end of the 2000 season, and it could be argued that Arizona and ASU haven't been the same


