CAPITAL AGOG AT ROOSEVELT RAP BY LEWIS

Break of Labor Leader With New Deal Liked By Republicans
CHARGES ARE MADE
Failure to Solve Issues in Seven Years Is Accusation

WASHINGTON, Jan. 24.—John L. Lewis' warning that a Roosevelt third term attempt faces "inimigious" defeat caused a sensation in Washington today and prompted new talk that the labor leader might support to Senator Wheeler (D-Mont.) for President.

His speech at Columbus, Ohio, was widely regarded as the opening of a campaign to influence the Democratic platform at the coming convention. Lewis' warning, in addition to his attack on the New Deal, was regarded as a possible support to Wheeler.

Charges Stated

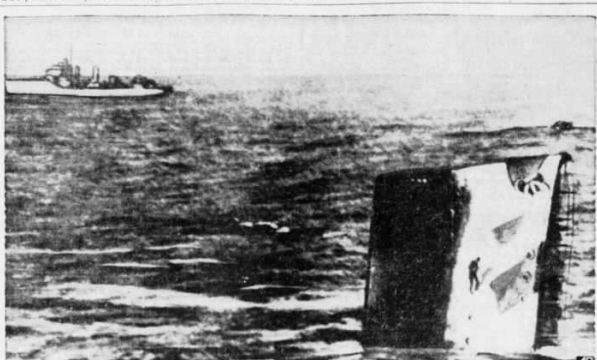
