Spaniards Say Mussolini New Has 50,000 Men Aiding Insurgents

BATTLE TIDE TURNED Latest Franco Offensive Reported Repulsed in Guadalajara

MADRID, March 14.—(AP)—Spanish government accounts of the victory at Trijueque on the Guadalajara front said tonight 90 additional Italian aviators and soldiers had been captured in what was described as almost a rout of insurgents.

An official account said the Italian aviators were captured, said six Italian divisions, approximately 50,000 men, were concentrated on the Guadalajara front.

The prisoners were reported taken in the town of Trijueque on the Guadalajara front. Government troops assembled on the ground plane of the town, repulsed them with the capture of 12 Italian aviators and 500 soldiers.

Madrid Press Quote General Jose Miaja, government commander in central Spain, reported the Madrid front was quiet.
