HOUSE LOPS BIG CHUNK FROM THE '39 RELIEF BILL

Representatives Cut 150 Millions From F.D.R.'s Appropriations
COALITION FORMED
Amendments Added to Take Policy Out of Relief; Senate Next

WASHINGTON, Jan. 13.—(AP)—The House, rebelling against President Roosevelt's spending policies, passed tonight a \$725,000,000 emergency relief appropriation—\$100,000,000 less than recommended by the chief executive.

Republicans, their ranks augmented by the November election, voted with conservative Democrats in an effective coalition to slash the bill before the final vote was reached. The vote on the bill was 239 to 187.

Various limited
The chamber inserted restrictions aimed at the elimination of political patronage and the curbing of the power of the administration. It applied an across-the-board cut in pay rates for similar work, but not by more than 25 per cent throughout the country.

House Democrats were solidly behind the amendment. The day's developments brought rapid fulfillment of predictions made by political observers that the election of last fall, that the bill would be amended to a coalition of conservatives of both parties sufficiently numerous to keep the President on many points of the program.

The amount of appropriating \$725,000,000 instead of \$725,000,000 was granted under particular provisions which prevented a roll call vote on the size of the appropriation.

Charges Made
This fact was a source of deep disappointment to many members who supported the President's amendment. Some of them, notably Representative Cannon (D-Mo.), who introduced the amendment, charged the movement for the larger appropriation, charged that the procedure had been invoked to keep one member from being put on the spot on the issue.
