'RUNNER STORYLINES

- ► CSUB fell in its first road game of the year, at Georgia Southern, 77-53.
- ▶ R-senior **Fallou Ndoye** led all'Runners with 13 points (6-8 FG) and 6 boards.
- ▶ R-Junior **Damiyne Durham** scored 12 points (4-12 FG) and added 6 rebounds.
- `Runners hit just 7-of-22 free throws (32%) after shooting 81% vs. Whittier.
- ▶ CSUB is coming off another highly successful season with a 25-10 record, its first WAC regular-season championship, and a run to the NIT semifinals.
- ▶ The `Runners became the first eight seed to reach the NIT in the tournament's history
- ► CSUB's 25 wins was a new Division I school record for a single-season.
- ▶ The `Runners went 12-1 at home with their only loss against Grand Canyon, Mar. 4.
- ► CSUB lost 3 of 5 starters from a year ago (Jaylin Airington, Matt Smith, and Dedrick Basile), but returns senior starters Brent Wrapp and Shon Briggs.



CSUB HEAD COACH ROD BARNES

- ► Rod Barnes was named head men's basketball coach in March of 2011.
- ► Entering his 17th season as a collegiate coach, holds an overall record of 292-277 (.513) and is 106-88 (.552) in his seventh season at CSUB.
- ▶ 2017 College Insider Hugh Durham Mid-Major Coach of the Year
- ► 2015-16 Western Athletic Conference 'Don Haskins Coach of the Year' award winner.
- ►The only player in the history of the SEC to win both 'Player of the Year' (1988) and 'Coach of the Year' (2001).
- ▶2001 Naismith Coach of the Year.
- ► Has also been the head coach at Ole Miss (141-109 from 1998-2006) and Georgia State (44-79 from 2007-2011).
- ► Has served as an assistant coach at Livingston University (1990-1993), Ole Miss (1993-1996) and Oklahoma (2006-2007).
- ► Has led two teams to the NCAA Tournament (Ole Miss & CSUB).
- ► Led Ole Miss to the NCAA Tournament three times including a 2001 Sweet 16 appearance.

LAST TIME VS ARIZONA

- ► CSU Bakersfield met Arizona in Tucscon a year ago. The Wildcats won the first half 44-36, but a strong second half performance helped the `Runners outscore Arizona 40-34 in a 78-66 loss on the road, Nov. 15, 2016.
- ▶ Jaylin Airington scored 31 points to keep CSUB in the game.
- ▶ That meeting was just the second all-time for the two programs and only the first since the inagural meeting in 1973 (Arizona won 94-87 in Tucson).

ROWDY'S WEEKEND ROUNDUP

- ► CSUB travelled across the country to take on Georgia Southern in their first road game of the season. The Eagles jumped out early and cruised to a 77-53 win.
- ▶ Redshirt senior **Fallou Ndoye** led all `Runners with 13 points on 6-of-8 shooting while adding six rebounds. Redshirt junior **Damiyne Durham** chipped in 12 points (4-12 FG, 2-8 3PT) and six rebounds.
- ▶ As a team, CSUB shot 23% from the three-point range while GS converted on 45%. The `Runners only hit 32% of their free throws (7-22) in the game.
- ▶ Bakersfield kicked off the regular season Nov. 10 with a win against Whittier, 88-66
- ▶ Fresh. Jarkel Joiner had a game-high 23 points (9-15 FG) to go with 6 boards.
- ▶ Senior **Shon Briggs** scored 13 points and added 8 rebounds.
- ➤ `Runners hit 21-of-26 free throws (81%) after shooting 64% as a team last season.
- ▶ The Poets started out hot with a trio of 3-pointers early on and held the lead for 13 minutes. CSUB gained its first lead at 24-22 and never looked back.
- ▶ Bakersfield shot 42% from the field, but only 31% from behind the arc (9-of-29).
- ▶ Redshirt senior **Brent Wrapp** had 9 points,6 assists, and 3 steals in just 22 min.

2016-17 SEASON RECAP

- ► CSU Bakersfield's men's basketball team experienced its second-straight season with exposure on the national level.
- ▶ Last season, the Roadrunners made a run through the National Invitational Tournament and eventually finding themsleves competing inside Madison Square Garden in the NIT Semifinals. They became the first team in history to reach the semifinals as an eigth-seed.
- ▶ CSUB ended their season in a loss against Geogia Tech on March 28,2017.
- ▶ 'Runners' defense was ranked third in NCAA Division I in opponents' field-goal percentage (37.2%), eighth in turnovers forced per game (16.6), 13th in total steals (286), and 22nd in points allowed per game (63.9).
- ► Set a new Division I record by recording 25 victories and eclipsing the 24-win season a year ago.
- ▶ Posted a 12-2 Western Athletic Conferece, the best ever since hoing the league in 2013
- ▶ First, Western Athletic Conference regular-season championship title and the first men's basketball title since the 1997-98 CCAA Championship won at the Division II level.

RECORDS TO WATCH

Chicago State

- ▶ Brent Wrapp finished the 2016-17 season third all-time for CSUB in career assists with 372. The redshirt senior needs 16 assists to catch Fred Eckles (1989-92) for second all-time at 388. From there, Wrapp has an outside shot at chasing down Kenny Warren's (1990-94) school record of 520. Wrapp has averaged 3.7 assists per game in his career.
- ▶ Damiyne Durham only needed two years to reach CSUB's Top 5 all-time for 3-point field goals made and attempted The redshirt junior enters the season third all-time in both categories with 186 3FGM and 536 3FGA. Kenny Warren (1990-94) owns the record for 3FGM at 278 and Durham's average of 93 per year would eclipse that total by one in just his third season as a `Runner. Durham is on pace to smash the 3FGA record (641, Kenny Warren, 1990-94) this season.

PRESEASON WAC HONORS

- ▶ Redshirt junior **Damiyne Durham** was selected Preseason First Team All-WAC in the coaches' poll. Senior **Shon Briggs** and redshirt senior **Brent Wrapp** earned Second Team nods.
- ▶ In the media poll, Durham dropped to the Second Team and was joined by Wrapp.

FORMER 'RUNNERS GOING PRO

- ▶ Former `Runner, **Tyrell Corbin** was named to the 15-man roster for the Charlotte Hornets NBA 2017 Summer league Corbin attended CSUB from 2013-15 and spent his last two season playing overseas for Bima Perkasa Jogja.
- ► Former 'Runner **Kevin Mays** signed a professional contract with BK Nova Hut Ostrava in the Czech Republic's NBL Mays was a first-team All-WAC selection in 2015-16, averaging 13 ppg and 8 rpg.
- ▶ Dedrick Basile, known for sinking the buzzer-beating three-pointer that sent CSUB to its first-ever NCAA Tournament, signed a contract with Alkar, a member of the top tier of Croatian basketball.
- ▶ Jaylin Airington inked a deal with Anwol of Poland this summer, a club that won the Polish league last year.
- ▶ Two-time All-WAC selection **Aly Ahmed** was drafted by the Sioux Falls Sky-force in the NBA Development League in 2016. Issues with his work visa that took too long to clear up caused Ahmed to miss his opportunity to join the Skyforce. He now has his green card and is hoping to be drafted in the G-League or play overseas. Ahmed was one of just four players in the history of CSUB to score at least 1,000 points and grab over 500 rebounds in his career.
- ► Ahmed became just the second Roadrunner ever drafted by the NBA D-League following **Tyrone White** who was selected in the third round by the Rio Grande Valley Vipers in 2014. White is currently playing professionally in Mexico.

EARLY SIGNINGS

- ▶ The Roadrunners welcomed their largest early signing class when four future Roadrunners signed their National Letters of Intent on Nov. 9.
- ▶ Darrin Person Jr. is a 6-7, 215-pound shooting guard from Immanuel High School in Reedley, Calif.

- ▶ Justin McCall, son of CSUB women's basketball head coach Greg McCall, is a forward from Ridgeview HS in Bakersfield.
- ▶ Jarkel Joiner is a point guard from Oxford HS in Oxford, Miss.
- ▶ Rickey Holden is the lone junior college signee, having played at Jones Community College in Ellisville, Miss.

`Runners in their first big dance in 2016

- ▶ For the first time in program history, the CSUB Roadrunners advanced to the 2016 NCAA Division I Men's Basketball Tournament where they fell to eventual Final Four participant Oklahoma 82-68 in the first round in Oklahoma City. The Roadrunners led several times during the game and trailed by just four points with just over four minutes remaining. It was the closest game Oklahoma had in the NCAA Tournament before losing to Villanova in the Final Four.
- ► CSUB was the second team that head coach **Rod Barnes** led to the NCAA Tournament after taking Ole Miss to the Dance three times ('99, '01, '02).
- ► Seniors **Aly Ahmed** (16 pts) and **Kevin Mays** (14 pts) led the way for the Roadrunners in their final career games for CSUB.
- ▶ Dedrick Basile scored 13 points for CSUB in the NCAA Tournament game including a 5-of-11 performance from the field and 3-of-7 from three-point range.

Played at Oxford HS in Oxford, Miss. where he was fourth in the nation his senior season averaging 36.5 points per game for the Chargers who advanced to the semifinals of the state playoffs. Was named 2017 Mississippi Boy's Basketball Player of the Year by The Daily Journal.... added two assists and six rebounds per game.

Has led the WAC in assist-to-turnover ratio for the last three seasons...currently third on CSUB's all-time assist list with 372...on pace to finish second all-time for CSUB in assists...ranks 16th among NCAA Division I active leaders in career assists.

Scored 9 points vs. Whittier Nov. 11 to go with 6 assists and 3 steals...2 points, 6 rebounds, 5 assists against Georgia Southern.

Helped CSUB reach school's first National Invitational Tournament and become first No. 8 seed in NIT history to reach NIT semifinal...helped CSUB defense to be ranked in Top 15 in NCAA Division I in steals (286) and turnovers forced (16.6) per game and field goal percentage defense (37.2)...ranked 60th in NCAA DI in assist-to-turnover ratio (2.30) and led WAC for third straight season...named Academic All-WAC...finished season third all-time for CSUB in career assists (372)...led CSUB in assists (3.6) while averaging 4.7 points and 3.7 rebounds a game.
