WASHINGTON, March 31.—(AP)—New destructive bombing of Japanese bases on New Guinea and Timor were announced today as Australian commanders reported that the aircraft had been destroyed at Lae, on the northern coast of New Guinea, and that 40 Japanese planes were destroyed on the ground at Koroheh, Timor.
