Sarah Bernhardt's Condition Reported to Be Serious Again

Paris, March 24.—Madame Sarah Bernhardt is critically ill, perhaps dying. This remarkable woman, who belongs to the world as well as to France, is fighting against the ravages of disease, but her weakened constitution makes the odds much against her.

After a long consultation to-night, the attending physicians issued the following bulletin:

"The condition of Mrs. Bernhardt has become aggravated in the last few days, and the prognosis must be reserved. The expected issue would lead to the belief that the possibility of a recovery is remote. Bernhardt's condition is such that she would only survive for a few days. It is not possible to state to her and only this week has she been in a fit state for an American journey, she probably over-estimated her strength."

Madame Bernhardt, who observed her 75th birthday on October 20, last, suffered a collapse as the result of a new day in Paris on December 1. She made light of the affair at the time, terming it a mere falling out, and declaring that she would soon be back before the hospital, she suffered several relapses and on December 24 was reported to be dying. She never recovered from this set-back, however, and on January 10, at a moment when she had been reported to be recovering, she died. She was 75 years old at the time.
