AMERICANS TO BE PROTECTED FROM SUBMERSIBLES AT GREAT COST

While President Does Not Plan to Declare War, Any Steps Required for Safety of Citizens Will Be Taken; to Go Before Congress Shortly

WASHINGTON, Feb. 17.—(By Associated Press.)—The administration has made it plain that it will not declare war until it is satisfied that the United States is in a position to defend itself against any possible attack.

Afterward it was indicated that the question had not such a step under consideration because of the possibility that after adjustment some sudden emergency might require action to be taken before Congress could be brought into session.

Wilson Full Authority
The suggestion was made that Congress might be asked to pass a broad resolution authorizing the president to take any necessary measures for the protection of American rights and to meet any emergency which may arise.

Flagrant Violation of Rights Inevitable
