

SUNSHINE CLUB SET TO AID EVACUEES

Mayors and chambers of commerce in Southern California have been advised of Tucson's ability and facilities to care for persons who may have to be evacuated from Pacific coast areas. This data has been supplied by the Tucson Sunshine Club, in the form of a special bulletin sent out Tuesday. It follows:

"We have already received from your area many requests for information concerning living accommodations from persons who have become alarmed by war news bulletins and who wish to move into what they consider to be safer zones.

"A housing survey in Southern Arizona—Tucson, Douglas, Bisbee, Nogales—reveals immediate accommodations available for approximately 10,000 persons. This includes hotels, motor courts, guest ranches, working cattle ranches and private homes.

"There are no defense industrial plants in this area; air and land protection are afforded by Davis-Monthan Field and Fort Huachuca.

"Rates for houses and apartments are from \$50.00 a month up. Guest ranches from \$45.00 a week up, per person. Hotels and motor courts from \$2.00 a day European plan and \$3.50 a day American plan. Better rates for permanent stays.

"This information can be given to those inquiring for data. Communicate with us if we can be of any service to you or to any of your citizens."
