ACTORS TALK POWER NEEDS ON RUSSIAN FRONT

Muslini and Mussolini Hold Two-Day Conference At Salzburg

JAPAN ENVOY ABSENT

Discipline Both in Germany and Italy Also Stressed

GERMANS SWITZERLAND May 1.—Adolf Hitler and Benito Mussolini were reported tonight to have dined in the mountains during two days of conference at Salzburg on programs for increasing the number of effective Axis troops in the Russian front and right enforcement of discipline both in Germany and Italy.

They also were believed to have discussed the possibility of diplomatic analysts to have gone up to negotiating this spring, after three weeks of unfruitful overtures.

Axis communists today disclosed the bare facts of the two-day meeting Wednesday and Thursday, and Axis commentators are of the opinion that it was as usual, that it was a prelude to "great political and military moves" early this summer.

Nippon Not Represented

Contrary to expectations, the Japanese ambassador to Berlin, Gen. Hiroshi Kohno, was not on hand, and it was noted that official German accounts of the meeting put the "uniform" of the Axis and beyond that of the Japanese side of the conference.

It was stated that the Japanese determination of Germany and Italy and their allies to render the victory secure and that Japan was a separate entity in the military strategy.

30 Frenchmen Killed By Nazis in Reprisal For Giraud's Escape

Nazi-Controlled Plant In Belgium Wiped Out

Patriotic 'White Brigade' Believed by London to Have Played Part in Tremendous Blast at Gas and Explosive Factory at Tensenderloo

LONDON, May 1.—(AP)—A tremendous explosion has wiped out the German-controlled gas and explosive factory at Tensenderloo in southern Belgium, killed 250 persons and injured upwards of 1,000, according to the Nazi-occupied nation disclosed today.

The blast occurred in an industrial area where a natural gas well has been discovered and the implosion of the well has been reported. Belgium "White Brigade," a band of patriots which is preparing for one day when they can assist Allied invaders in the low countries, had now struck a blow to the gas and explosive industry.

The German army was in complete charge of the plant. The German account of the blast disclosed that the explosion occurred at 11:30 a. m. on Wednesday. Free Belgian sources here said the factory was owned by the Societe Anonyme Des Tensenderloo.

Berlin said it was "completely destroyed" and added:

"The devastating explosion extended over a radius of several kilometers. A technical school near the factory was completely destroyed. The blast also destroyed the main power station of the plant. ALLIED HEADQUARTERS, London, May 1.——Allied air forces swept down on an enemy airbase at Lase in New Guinea yesterday, and destroyed a band of paratroopers and machine-gunned 30 planes lined up on the ground in a surprise attack and roared off after starting numerous large fires, a communication source disclosed today.

In another raid on Salamaua, 200 planes were reported to have bombed the Japanese air base and destroyed the Japanese planes on the ground.

RAIDS ARE RESUMED

Vast Armada Sent Across Channel as Weather Clears Up

LONDON, May 1.——(AP)—Hundreds of British planes swung across the channel at late twilight today in what observers called one of the war's greatest single thrusts against the Nazi-held continent coast.

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BRMA ATTACKS TURN TOWARD CHINA AS JAP ADVANCE IS CONTINUED

Chungking Sends More Troops Down From Border to Meet Back Door Menace as British Retreat in Mandalay District

CHUNGKING, China, May 1.——(AP)—Free China, endangered as never before by a Japanese back-door thrust which has penetrated within 45 miles of her border, sent reinforcements streaming down the Burma road today in a supreme attempt to stop the Japanese columns racing through northeastern Burma.

Forging due north from captured, blazing Lashio, where the Mandalay railroad meets the main supply route through the mountains, the Japanese reached the vicinity of Hsawai, 22 miles northeast of Lashio along the Burma road.

The Chinese high command said tonight that the Chinese defenders were holding a stubborn stand at Hsawai under heavy pressure, and that although reinforcements already had been sent from China's Yunnan province.

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
