Tucson housing affordability improves after record low in 2022Housing affordability improved in the first quarter of 2023 for the Tucson metropolitan statistical area (MSA) and many of its peers. Tucson ranked second, just behind Albuquerque, with 46.8% of homes sold in the first quarter of 2023 considered affordable to a family earning the local median income. That was an 11.8 percentage point increase from the record low of 35.0% in the fourth quarter of 2022. The improvement in housing affordability was driven primarily by a decline in the median price of homes sold during the first quarter of 2023 and a modest increase in median family income. Despite the improvement, Tucson's housing affordability remains nearly 20 percentage points lower than a year ago. Affordable housing is important because it affects spending in other areas such as child care, education, health care and leisure activities.
