After 300 Years of Dynasty Ruled by Manchus Country Becomes a Republic; Dowager Empress Agrees to Give Up Country

SEEKS ONLY PEACE AND UNION OF PROVINCES

PEKING, Feb. 12.—After overruling the throne in China for nearly three centuries, the Manchu dynasty, represented by the child emperor P'u Yi, abdicated today. Three edicts were issued, the first providing abdication, the second dealing with the immediate establishment of the republic, and the third trying a maintenance of peace and unifying the provinces.
