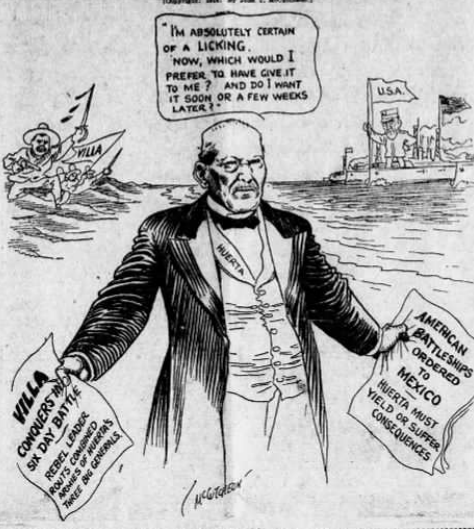

MEXICO CITY, April 20.—General Huerta offers all guarantee to foreigners, Americans included, who remain in Mexico. He will improve his opportunity to show the world that the government of Mexico is moral and civilized." This statement Huerta dictated to the Associated Press.
