

- SUBJECT: April 2014 Hospital Financial Results

The hospital financial survey results for April show a continuation of the trend starting in January of a significant drop in uncompensated care as shown in the graph below:



This increase and subsequent reduction in uncompensated care (combination of bad debt write-offs and charity) reflects the following changes in AHCCCS coverage:

- May 1, 2011 freeze on enrollment in the medical spend down program.
- July 8, 2011 freeze on enrollment in the childless adult program.
- January 1, 2014 restoration of the Prop. 204 program and adult expansion to 133 percent of the federal poverty level.

Other Key Results


• For the month, over 75 percent of the hospitals, based on inpatient cases, responded to the survey. The cost of uncompensated care for the month and year to date compared to prior periods is illustrated below:

• The operating margins for reporting hospitals as a percentage have increased as illustrated below.

- Some hospitals are still losing money from operations. In April, 30 percent of the reporting hospitals incurred a loss from operations.
