CONSUMERS STAMPEDE. British buyers race to pay for kitchen appliances, televisions, cigarettes, liquor and other goods before sweeping tax increases aimed at balancing the budget go into effect.

TAX CUT. Beginning with psychoactive drugs today, Americans will be getting a few dollars more for their labors.

N.WEAPON STORAGE. U.S. nuclear weapons have been stored in Europe so long that they have become vulnerable to terrorist attack.

VOTING RIGHTS UPHOLD. The House Judiciary Committee rejects on a tie vote a measure that would have allowed states to obtain a court order exempting them from the provisions of the Voting Rights Act.

AMERICAN INDIAN MOVEMENT. At a meeting in St. Paul last weekend, the American Indian Movement decided to expand its program of "survival schools."

MARILYN COX CASE. The four children of Marilyn Cox, who was killed by a bullet from a Tucson policeman's gun, have been awarded a total of \$130,000 in damages by a Superior Court jury.
