Wages in Tucson pick up significantly

Tucson's median wage for all occupations was \$42,430 in 2022, which ranked eighth among the 12 metropolitan areas tracked on the MAP Dashboard. Tucson's median wage was \$3,880 below the U.S. median, an improvement from 2021 when it was nearly \$8,000 lower. Management occupations paid the most in Tucson at \$89,070, while food preparation and serving jobs paid the least, at \$29,570. Occupational wages tell workers which jobs provide the largest payoff, therefore influencing residential location decisions and educational choices. Wages in Tucson picked up significantly in 2022, increasing by 11.5%.
