

Klux Builds \$1,500,000 Palace

Atlanta Promoters Undertake \$100,000 Advertising Campaign and Talk of Other Projects Meaning Millions—Costly Homes Acquired by Leaders—Lanier University Taken Over and Emperor Simmons Made President.

PROFITABLE SALES OF EQUIPMENT FOLLOW \$10 DONATIONS FROM OVER HALF MILLION MEMBERS

Imperial Wizard Has a Wizard-like Financial Adviser in Imperial Kléagle Clarke, to Whom, by "a Sort of Gentlemen's Agreement," Lump Sums Are Voted Regularly by Supreme Committee as Pay—Leaders Openly Boast of Commercializing Klan.

Singing a hymn of hate against selected groups of American citizens, employing on a commission basis a large and would-be hidden force of expert organizers, promoted by adroit and not over-scrupulous methods, reviving a tradition of secretive and cowardly violence and lawlessness, the Ku Klux Klan has been burrowing

tortuously under the surface of American life.

Not the least revolting aspect of the activities of incorporated Ku Kluxism uncovered by the investigation is the fact that all this has been undertaken and managed as a revenue producing business enterprise, and has manifestly paid well.

FLOOD OF MONEY IS POURING IN; KLAN'S CHIEF TALKS IN MILLIONS

Every Klansman parts with a \$10 "donation" at the invisible box office which flanks the portal of the Invisible Empire, and in ordinary routine this sum is "split" as follows:

Pocketing \$4, the Kléagle who signs the candidate on the dotted line forwards the remaining \$6 to his King Kléagle, who keeps \$1 and forwards \$5 to his Grand Goblin. The Grand Goblin, according to a statement officially given out in New York recently by Mrs. Elizabeth Tyler, head of the newly created body of female Ku Kluxers, retains 50 cents, so that of every "donation" \$4.50 goes to the "Imperial" treasury.

But if a higher ranking salesman obligates a new member the division is different. A King Kléagle thus selling directly keeps \$5 of the fee, a Grand Goblin keeps \$5.50, while if Emperor Simmons himself leans over the counter and personally baptizes a customer the \$10 reaches the imperial pocket intact.

Disregarding the Imperial Wizard's own sales, which necessarily form but a small part of the volume of business done, each new Klansman means \$4.50 added to the Ku Klux bank roll. Conservatively discounting the Klan's own claims as to total membership and making the present number \$500,000, the Ku Klux sales campaign has so far brought its managers a gross profit of \$2,250,000. To this income must be added receipts from other sources which will be mentioned later in this article. Altogether, propagating incorporated Ku Kluxism with patriotic trimmings has proved a paying undertaking, as there is plenty of evidence to show.

Lanier University, named for the famous southern poet, was launched a number of years ago under the auspices of the Southern Baptist association, and was at first housed in a business building in Atlanta. Later it moved far out on the north side of the city, near the fashionable Druid Hills residential section and Emory university, one of the south's largest educational institutions. The Lanier property consists of three acres of ground and three buildings, only one of which is completed.

The enrolment is not heavy, and recently one of the teachers gave out a statement that nine faculty members and several scores of students had gone "on strike" because the institution had not met its contractual obligations to them in regard to board and other matters, though these charges were afterward denied by those in charge.

But since the Ku Klux Klan entered the educational field and Emperor Simmons became a college president, Lanier University must have taken on a new lease of life, to judge from advertisements clipped from southern newspapers. According to these advertisements, Lanier is:

"A school that is distinctive. Opens under entirely new management and faculty. A school laying unusual stress upon Christian prin-

proved, her manner of dress become more stylish.

"She has affected old southern cam-cos, medallions and plain dresses and become very striking looking. She now owns two automobiles and a beautiful home in the suburbs of Atlanta. During the drive of the Anti-Saloon league for a \$25,000,000 fund, Mrs. Tyler rode over Atlanta in an airplane and distributed literature as part of the publicity program undertaken by Mr. Clarke. She is a fearless, daring operator in everything she undertakes.

"The Big Three in the K. K. K. movement at the present time are Simmons, Clarke and Mrs. Tyler. 'Colonel' Simmons beats the drum and does the sob work, while Clarke and Mrs. Tyler increase the membership and fill the coffers."
