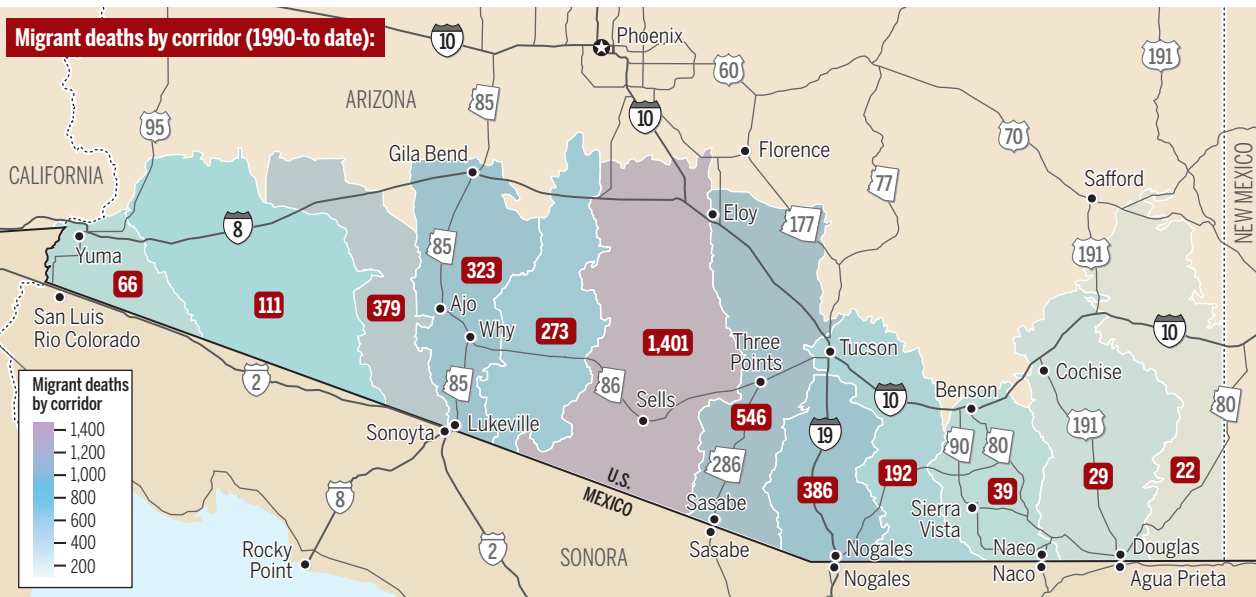


Desert west of Tucson deadliest for migrants

The remains of more than 3,900 migrants were found in Southern Arizona on record since around 1990. The bulk of those deaths occurred in the desert west of Tucson, particularly on the Tohono O'odham Nation, while far fewer were reported in Cochise County.
