NATION'S OLDER MEN REGISTER FOR WAR WORK

President Heads List as Many Leaders Put Down Names

13 MILLIONS SIGNED Check on Ability Sought To Speed Job of Fighting

WASHINGTON, April 27.—The selective service finished registering the nation's oldest men today, about 1,000,000 of them, including one who, filling out his card, said he was blue-eyed, gray-haired, ruddy-complexioned and that his place of employment was the White House.

When the last card was filed, the government had previously received of virtually every man in the United States who was 45 or over, February 16, 1942, who had not reached 65 by that date, but it will need a questionnaire to get out what information it wants to know.

President Roosevelt visited the White House to enroll President Hoover, his chief of staff, James D. Hays, and other men, made a little talk, and then left for the ceremony, which he indicated that the registering of the old executive was "proof" that all of this democracy was in the fight.
