In 2008, a nurse who ran the Ovarian Cancer Mind/Body Support Group, organized the first trip to Vermont, for the Stowe Weekend of Hope. Everyone loved it, and some of those women continue to attend to this day. Every year the number of participants grows, with approximately 250 BMC survivors and guests among the crowd of partakers at this year's event!

As a safety-net hospital, BMC receives many patients short on resources, options and opportunities. This makes going to Stowe and attending the Weekend of Hope all the more a special occasion for our survivors who make the trip. For many, this is a rare chance to get out of the city.

"Because of the health fair they have, the relaxation, clean air, no sirens...

"It helps me relax my body, my spirit, my mind and keep me away from getting stressed."

"As a caregiver for my 93-yr-old mom, it is the only time I can get away yearly."

Of course, once out of the city, newcomers are especially moved by the beautiful environment, the welcoming friendliness of the locals, the depth of the programming, and the encouragement and connections felt with other survivors.

"It's helpful to know the fears you experienced and continue to experience are common to most survivors. [The Weekend of Hope] was a very educational and a truly positive experience to go through with my husband."

"There were things I hadn't gotten answers on before about my type of cancer." "We're treated with the utmost respect wherever we went."

"I so enjoyed the first trip. It was informative, simple, and joyful. My partner was able to understand more about cancer—caregiving support, etc. So it was good for both of us."

For the past three years, Jeff Gallahue, cancer survivor, founder of the organization We Beat Cancer, and Weekend of Hope Keynote Speaker in 2014 has directed his organization to donate a grand sum of money to cover the major expenses of BMC's large-scale participation in the Weekend of Hope. They cover all costs for two 54-seat buses that bring almost half of our people up to Stowe and the back home to Boston; gas cards for the 50 people driving their cars up; the big Friday night dinner for all BMC folks; and the cost of the rooms for survivors returning for their 2nd, 3rd, 4th, or 8th time! We can never thank you enough, Jeff!

I would also like to thank the staff and volunteers of the Stowe Weekend of Hope. They are some

of the most patient people on the planet who work tirelessly for months overseeing every detail to make the Weekend of Hope the incredible success that it is every year. Accommodating BMC and its ranging assortment of needs is no small task. Sparing you the details, I'll tell you that for about 6 or 7 weeks before the event, communication goes back and forth almost daily by email or phone hammering out arrangements. No matter how prepared we are, new things always come up, but with a rapport developed over several years now, we're ready for whatever happens.

Thank you so much to everyone for all you do, for extending yourselves over and over again, for never missing a beat, forever keeping an even keel, and for always being a total delight to work with!
