

A shrinking lake reveals its secrets

Stretching 186 miles upstream of Glen Canyon Dam, Lake Powell draws more than 3 million boaters, fishers and other recreators annually. But low water has made access to the lake increasingly tough. Ten of 12 ramps leading from marinas now are at least partially closed. Some visitors lament they've lost access to certain side canyons where the water is too low for boats. Environmentalists, however,

are cheering the return to public view of treasured Glen Canyon sites exposed by the receding water such as Cathedral In the Desert. Other sites flooded by Lake Powell, such as Music Temple and Hidden Passage, remain underwater.
