

MAN WHO BROKE JAIL HERE IN 1918 TO BE RETURNED

Wilson Still Has Two Years in Illinois Cell, but Black Hawk Will Get Him.

E. Lynn Wilson, Black Hawk county jail breaker away back in 1918, faces a long period of restricted freedom. County Attorney

W. A. Cook yesterday received word from the sheriff at Chester, Ill., that Wilson has served one year of a three-year sentence, and was asked whether Black Hawk county will want him in 1927. Sheriff H. T. Wagner said today that Wilson, when in the county jail here, was wanted all over the country for violations of the law. Since his escape, the sheriff says, Wilson has served time in different places and is an habitual criminal. "Because he preys upon society and, when at liberty is a menace to public order, we plan to bring Wilson back here in 1927 to answer to the crime of jail breaking, which carries a penalty of five years in the penitentiary. Any ordinary case would be dropped, but with Wilson it is different. We feel that the longer he can be kept in confinement the better off society will be," said the sheriff.
