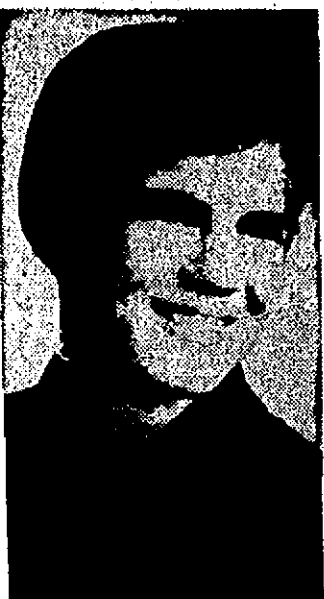
**A boor's a boor . . . women qualify**

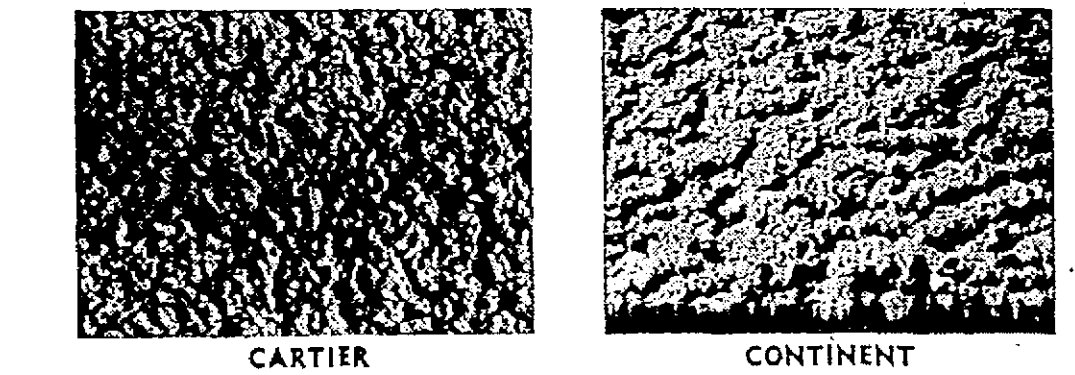
