

Three Cedar Falls Churches Plan Yule Eve Services

CANDLE LIGHTING RITES AT EVANG'L, FIRST METHODIST

Sixty Persons in U. S. Forces to Be Honored at Latter Church.

Cedar Falls—Three Cedar Falls churches are planning midnight services for Christmas eve, all open to the general public, and all according to usual custom.

The midnight candle lighting service at First Methodist church will be held from 11 to 12 o'clock midnight. The service will consist of carols, special instrumental and vocal music, a brief meditation by the pastor, Rev. H. Hughes Dill, and a ritual of candle lighting. Each attendant will be provided with a candle as he enters the church.

Candles to Homes.
The 60 young men and women of the church who are in the service of their country will be represented by 60 red, white and blue candles extending the full length of the chancel rail.

As the roll of those in the armed service is called, a member of each family will go to the chancel and light the candle representing their loved one.

The candles will be taken to the homes following the services, where they will be re-lighted on Christmas morning in honor of the service man or woman.

The candles of all the worshippers will then be lighted, the other lights in the sanctuary extinguished, and the service closed with the singing of "Silent Night."

Rites from 11 to 12.
The eighth annual Christmas candle light service at First Evangelical church will be held Thursday evening from 11 to 12 o'clock midnight, with Rev. Oliver M. Yaggy, pastor, giving the invocation and benediction, and the choir and soloists furnishing the music.

The lighting of the Christmas candles will be performed by Light Bearers Margery Mether and Miriam Baumgartner.

Soloists will be Calvin Mether, who plays as a trombone number "O Come, Let Us Adore"; Merritt Nelson, who sings "Cantique de Noel"; and Paul O. Seifert, church organist, who plays "Christmas Prelude" from Eighth Concerto by Correll, and "Christmas Carols," selected organ meditation. Mr. Seifert will also play the prelude, "Largo and Finale" (Westenholme), and the postlude, "A Rose Breaks Into Bloom" (Schreiner).

Choir Numbers.
The choir numbers will be "Adeste Fideles" as the processional, "O Sanctissimus," "Today, There Is Ringing," "Bethlehem, the Shepherd's Nativity hymn," "Behold, I Bring You Good Tidings," "There Were Shepherds," "Ye Watchers and Ye Holy Ones," "Silent Night," and the recessional, "Hark the Herald Angels."

Midnight services at St. Patrick's Catholic church will begin at 11:50 p. m. There will be a procession of 40 altar boys, followed by veneration at the crib of the Christ child, and the singing of the high mass.

Rev. Fr. Gregory Hemsell will sing the mass, and Rev. Fr. S. J. Mauer, priest-in-charge, will give the Christmas sermon.

Des Moines—(AP)—Dr. Robert L. Parker, medical director for the Des Moines public schools, Wednesday urged children who have colds or sore throats when classes are resumed Jan. 4 to stay at home while there is danger of passing their infection on to others.

Dr. H. E. Ransom, city health commissioner, disclosed that a wave of bronchitis has swept the city during the last 10 days.

The health officials attributed the condition to sudden weather changes and advised persons susceptible to such infection to avoid large crowds during the holidays.

ORANGE SCHOOL'S VACATION 2 DAYS

Cut to Allow Early Closing in May, for Farm Labor.

Orange consolidated school is limiting its Christmas vacation to Dec. 24 and 25 this year, so that school can close early, about May 5, to provide additional farm labor from the ranks of the high school students this summer. A. E. Jewett, Black Hawk county superintendent of schools, said Wednesday. This will be about three weeks earlier than the usual summer closing date.

Some other consolidated schools are planning similar early closing arrangements this summer.

Pupils Stay Till 5.
Daylight saving time has resulted in some schools throughout the county remaining in session until 4:30 or 5 p. m., because lack of lighting facilities prevents opening of classes early in the morning, during the short winter days, Superintendent Jewett said.

Food in the rural schools has electric lights, he said.

Superintendent Jewett explained that many farm families have children in Waterloo high schools and take the younger children to the rural schools on the way to town. In many cases, these children remain until 4:30 or 5 p. m., when it is light enough to study, and find it necessary to continue classes late in the day to get in the required study time.

Vacation Times Vary.
Different schools of the county adopted various Christmas vacation times. Those that closed last Friday had Christmas programs on that day. Raymond school had its Christmas program Tuesday and then began its vacation.

Because Christmas and New Year's days come on Friday this year, schools that closed Wednesday will have vacation the remainder of this week and all of next week.
