The Issuance Of <u>\$5,805,000</u> Tax Bonds By The City Of Mineral Wells For Acquiring A Building, And Constructing And Equipping Improvements To Said Building, To Be Used For A New City Hall, Including Municipal Courts, And Constructing And Equipping Renovations To The Existing City Hall Building And City Hall Annex

### **Bond Proposition C**

The Issuance Of \$3,960,000 Tax Bonds By The City Of Mineral Wells For Constructing And Installing A Water Line Along US Highway 180 West



## **Proposition A**

Proposition A involves street improvements which include contract reconstruction, in-house City crew reconstruction, capital maintenance and utility replacements associated with the proposed construction.

The proposed projects were selected in part from the most recent Five Year Street Plan and with estimated costs as shown on the following slides.

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## **Proposition B**

Proposition B involves the purchase/renovation and equipping of the former Bank of America Building located at 100 S.E. 6<sup>th</sup> Avenue to be used as a new City Hall.

Funds may also be used for renovations to the current City Hall and City Hall Annex buildings.

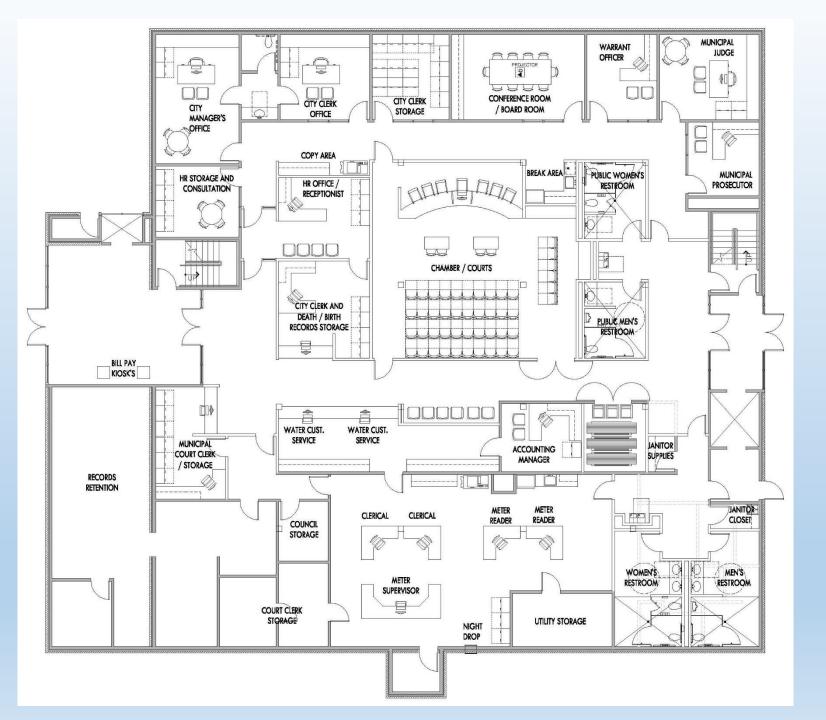

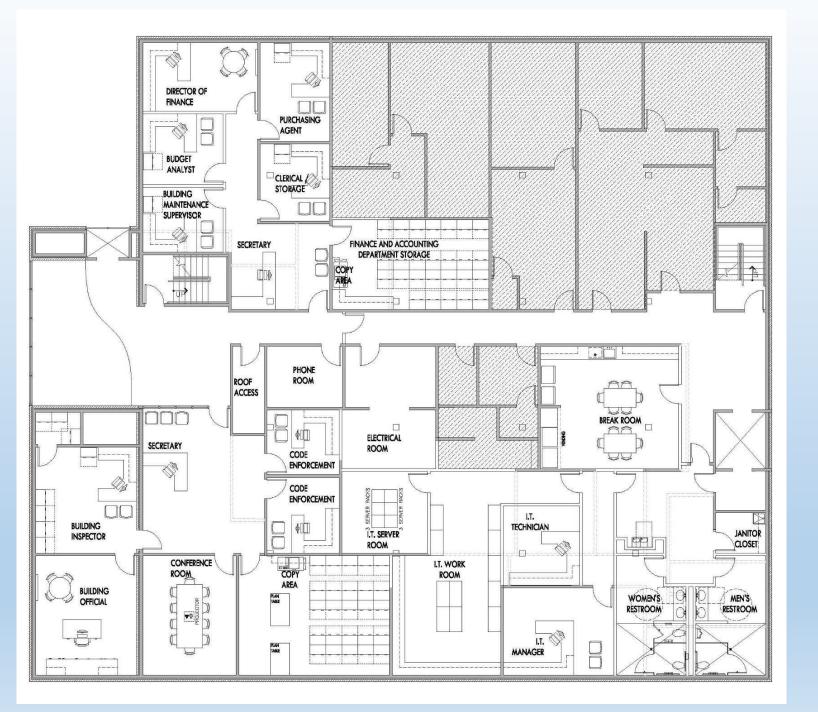




Architect's Drawings of Proposed City Hall Floorplan (Bank of America Building)

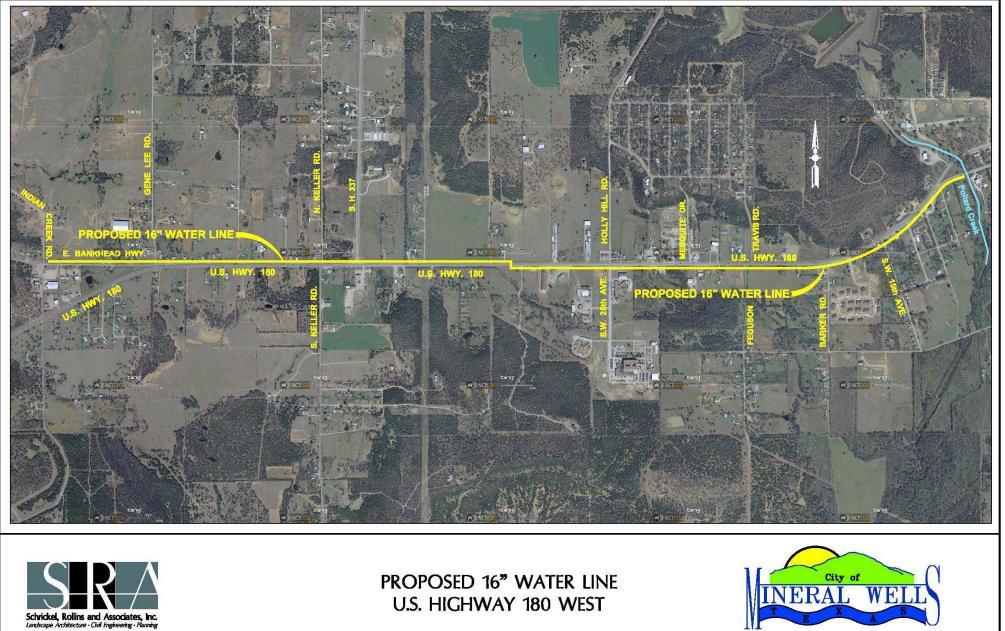
### **Proposition C**

Proposition C provides funding for the replacement of existing waterlines in Highway 180 West to a 16" main from roughly West City Park to Indian Creek Road.

This will alleviate current deficiencies in the water volume and pressure in this area and allow for future development along Highway 180 West.

Project Cost <u>\$3,750,000</u>

## **Proposition C**

### Highway 180 West Waterline Upgrade

Total Bond Amount Estimated Increase to <u>Monthly</u> Water Bill for Average Residential Customer (5000 gallons) <u>\$3,960,000</u> <u>\$1.72</u>



### **Other Considerations**

- As these are <u>individual propositions</u>, a citizen may vote FOR <u>or</u> AGAINST <u>any or all</u> of the propositions.
- Property taxes for residential homesteads of owners 65 and over are <u>frozen</u> and <u>will not increase</u> as a result of the Bond Election.



### Where can I vote?

A registered voter may vote at any Palo Pinto <u>or</u> Parker County voting center location in the County in which the voter resides for either Early or Election Day voting.

A list of these polling places is available to pick up after the meeting or at the City Hall Annex and City Hall.
