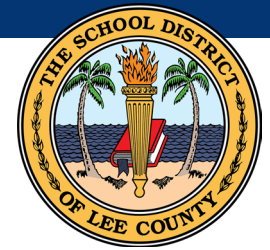

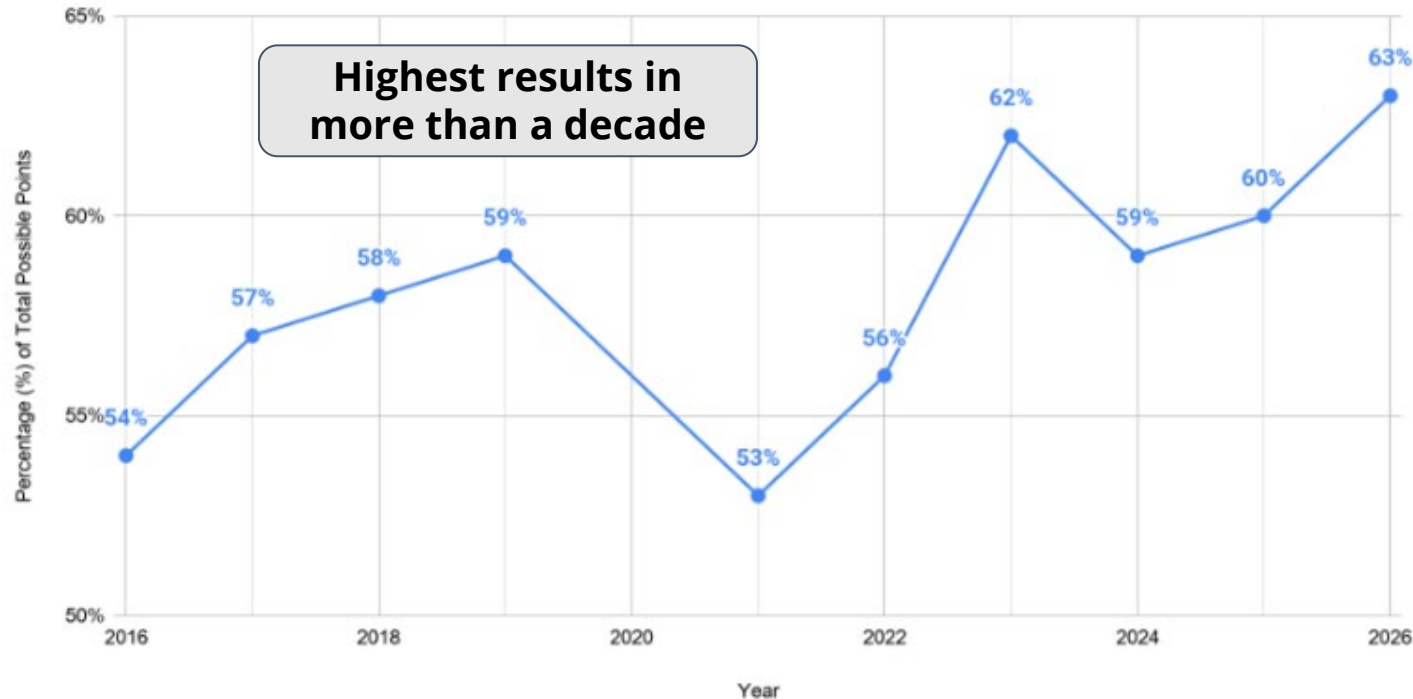

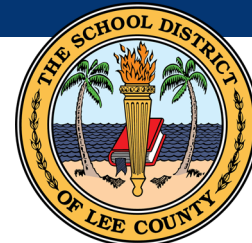


Lee County District Grade

School Grade Distribution

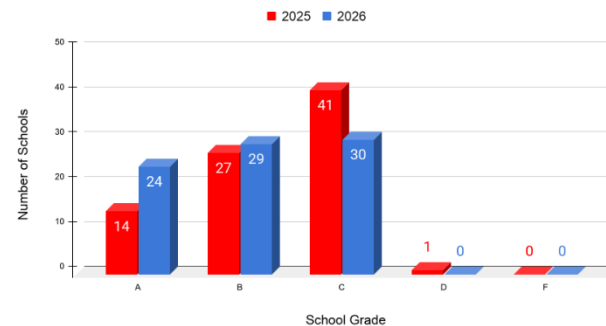


District Highlights:

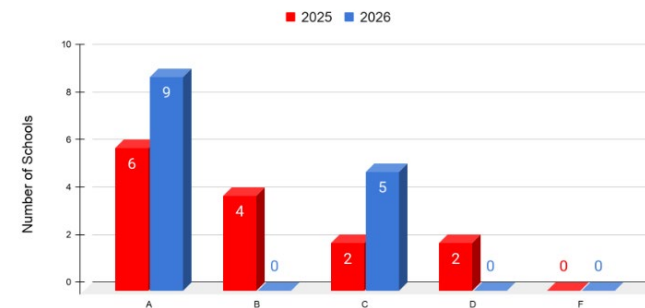
64% of Schools Earned **Top Marks**: **53** out of **83** traditional public schools received an **"A"** or **"B"** rating—a year-over-year (YOY) **increase** of **13** schools.

- **Surge** in **"A"** Ratings: **24** schools earned an **"A"** (up 10 schools YOY).
- **Steady "B"** Growth: **29** schools earned a **"B"** (up 2 schools YOY).
- **Shrinking "C"** Bracket: **30** schools earned a **"C"** (**Down 11** schools YOY, *reflecting upward movement*).
- **Zero** State Identified Underperforming Schools: **No** SDLC schools received a **"D"** or **"F"** rating this year (reflecting a YOY decrease of 1 school from the **"D"** category).

2025 vs 26 School Grade Distribution (Charters)





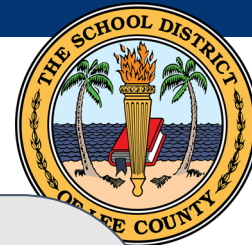
ESSA Support Categories

Lee County continues to increase the number of schools that are meeting or exceeding the Federal Percent of Points Index (FPPI) of 41% for each subgroup.

Specifically, there was a reduction in the number of schools in CSI status with one or more subgroups underperforming for 6 years; from 44 to 30.

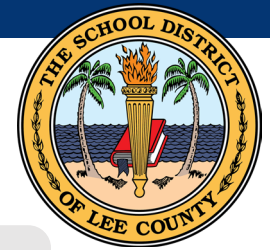
