

ON JULY 1, 2023, FLORIDA'S CONSTITUTIONAL CARRY LAW GOES INTO EFFECT.

- To carry a concealed firearm in Florida you must meet the same criteria required to qualify for a concealed weapons or firearms license as outlined in F.S.S.790.06.
- You are not required to complete training or pay a licensing fee.
- If you are traveling to another state it is still your responsibility to know and comply with that state's laws.



- Florida concealed licenses are still valid and will still be issued to qualifying individuals.
- Effective July 1, 2023, the State of Florida acknowledges all concealed firearm licenses lawfully issued by another state.
- Restrictions remain in place on where it is unlawful to carry a firearm.
