

## NOTICE OF AVAILABILITY

### DRAFT ENVIRONMENTAL ASSESSMENT FOR THE CHEYENNE FRONTIER DAYS PARK N RIDE AND PEDESTRIAN BRIDGE PROJECT IN CHEYENNE, WYOMING

The Federal Highway Administration (FHWA), in cooperation with the Wyoming Department of Transportation (WYDOT) and the City of Cheyenne, announces the availability of the Draft Environmental Assessment (EA) for the proposed Cheyenne Frontier Days (CFD) Park N Ride and Pedestrian Bridge Project. The Draft EA has been prepared in accordance with the National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA)(42 U.S.C. § 4321 et seq.), and FHWA implementing procedures (23 CFR Part 771). The Draft EA evaluates potential environmental, cultural, and socioeconomic impacts associated with construction and operation of a new off-site Park N Ride facility and a pedestrian bridge over Interstate 25. The Project is intended to improve traffic operations, event access, and pedestrian safety during Cheyenne Frontier Days and other large public events. Portions of the Project would occur on Francis E. Warren Air Force Base property and require a temporary use license from the U.S. Air Force, which is participating as a cooperating agency for purposes of NEPA compliance. A 30-day public review period begins February 9, 2026, and concludes March 11, 2026.
