










Bruner, Stevie Keener, Troy Watson, Landon Galyean, Jackson Key, Bryce Lancaster, Tommy Ledesma, Kendrick Oliver and Lucas Chappell.

Four Cardinals elected to continue their football careers following high school: Felts, Keener, Galyean and Chappell.

Ledesma, Galyean and Grubbs were all-conference offensive linemen that led the way for the Cards' efficient offense. Felts, Watson and Bruner combined for nearly 2,000 rushing yards and 27 rushing touchdowns. Keener was fifth on East Surry's career receiving yards list with nearly 1,900 vards and was second all-time in receiving touchdowns with 23.

Snow, Hamm and Chappell were named to the all-conference squad on defense and finished first, third and fifth on the team in total tackles a season ago. Keener and Felts, who combined for seven of East's 12 interceptions, received all-conference honors in the defensive backfield.

New challenges await the Cardinals in the 3A division, but coach Caleb Pardue said his team has put in the work needed to capitalize on these new opportunities.

"Our guys did a really good job in the offseason," said Pardue, who was the 2024 Foothills 2A Conference Coach of the Year. "We're making really great

strides in the weight room. We're trying to go beyond just getting faster and stronger and instead hone in on what we need to do in order to succeed at certain positions. That's helped us set certain targets to strive for and now we're seeing the positive results of that because of their hard work."

East Surry will have a mix of new and returning players who will take the field in Week One.

The Cardinals graduated three allconference offensive linemen from this past year's team. The one returning lineman that received all-conference honors was left tackle Cameron Allred.

"They don't build them any better than him," Pardue said. "He does everything the right way and does anything you ask him to."

Knox Galyean returns as the Cardinals' center. He and Allred will be joined on the line by Andrew Boles, Brett Moser and Ian Ledesma. The trio of juniors were impact players on JV in 2024 that Pardue said will help carry over the Cards' success in the trenches at the varsity level.

"We don't expect any drop-off there and are excited to show what those guys can do," he said.

A strong offensive line is crucial to the physical offense East utilized a year ago. The Cards ran for more than 2,600 yards while throwing for nearly 1,500.

Pardue wants this year's team to be versatile as well, whether the offense they run is option based or play action based. He hopes to spread the ball around both on the ground and in the air.

Junior JB Davis is expected to take over at quarterback for the Cardinals after serving as JV quarterback a year ago. Carter Motsinger, who passed for 994 yards and 10 touchdowns as a junior, will be the Cards' Swiss Army Knife that can play running back, wide receiver or even QB when needed.

"He can do a lot of special things with the ball in his hands," Pardue said.

Sophomores Nathan Kiger and Jon Hutchens will take over as the primary running backs. Each scored a varsity touchdown in 2024 but combined for just 11 carries. The Cardinals lost their four leading rushers from a year ago.

Logan Moore and Aidan Harpe will operate as wideouts, and Braxton Davis returns as East's tight end. Braxton's 15 receptions for 266 yards and three touchdowns ranked second on the team a year ago.

Caleb Bowman will also play tight end and some outside linebacker.

Ryan Metz returns as a defensive lineman for the Cardinals. Pardue said TJ Samples will make the jump to the varsity DL following an impressive JV campaign last year, and he will be joined by Aaden Wright.

"Aaden Wright has done an incredible job this offseason getting his body into shape to be an every down player," Pardue said of the 6-foot-5 360-pound lineman. "When he turns it on, he's terrifying. He's gonna have a huge year."

Josh Key, who was an all-conference hybrid defender in 2024, will shift to linebacker and play inside with another all-conference player, Porter Gibson. The pair combined for 155 total tackles as juniors.

Motsinger will act as one of East's leaders in the defensive backfield. He didn't play defense most of the 2024 season since he played quarterback, but he played significant minutes at DB as a sophomore in 2023.

Harpe, Logan Moore and Sam Freeman will join Motsinger in the backfield.

BIG GAMES

East Surry's nonconference opponents – only one of which is a fellow 3A team – had a combined record of 45-17 in 2024.

Starmount and Murphy each won multiple playoff games and at least 11 wins, while Walkertown and Statesville each won a playoff game and had at least eight wins.

North Forsyth now competes in the 5A division, and Statesville is part of the 6A division.

"We'll definitely be battle tested," Pardue said.

East Surry has won conference titles in five of the past six seasons, during which time the Cards are 33-1 against conference opponents. East defeated Forbush, North Surry and Surry Central in 2024 – with North being the only member of the former conference to score within 28 points of East – but came up short against both Mount Airy and West Stokes.

Mount Airy topped East Surry 28-7, and West Stokes defeated East 26-23 during the regular season and 35-21 in the state playoffs.



The Greyhounds graduated 13 seniors in the Class of 2025: Derrick Simmons, Dayvion Duncan, Isaac Webb, Kam McKnight, Owen McMillian, Najm Hines, Payten Sechrist, Alex Cazares, Braxton Montgomery, Anthony Williams, Juan Rico, Eli Ramey and Uriah Kearse.

Kearse, Webb, McKnight and Williams will all continue their football careers in college.

The Greyhounds lost a significant portion of their offense including their entire offensive line, quarterback and four of the five leading receivers. McKnight operated as QB behind a veteran offensive line for two years. As a senior, McKnight threw for more than 2,500 yards and 26 touchdowns. McMillian and Webb were both allconference receivers, while Ramey, Williams and Montgomery were allconference linemen.

Kearse and Williams were each all-conference selections on the

defensive line, while Sechrist earned the honor as a defensive back. Kearse, Williams, Sechrist, Cazares and Simmons finished second through sixth on the team in total tackles and combined for 16 of the team's 26 sacks.

SEASON OUTLOOK

A mix of youth and experience has North Surry coach Jackson Smith excited about the 2025 season.

"We returned some studs but definitely had a lot of holes to fill," Smith said. "These guys bought in to the process. We have a bit of a smaller freshman class, but even with the overall roster size down a little our summer attendance was up. That's a credit to this senior class and their desire to keep building our program.

"It's been really cool to see this senior class take over and receive the torch from last year's seniors."

Even with all their losses on offense, the Greyhounds return a pair of explosive all-conference athletes to lead the unit: Fisher Leftwich and Zamarri Sweatman.

Leftwich was the 2024 Foothills 2A Conference Offensive Player of the Year as a combination wide receiver and running back. He racked up more than 1,000 receiving yards and 13 receiving touchdowns, then added 339 yards and 12 touchdowns on the ground. He scored at least one touchdown in all 11 games and scored multiple touchdowns in nine games.

"Fisher does whatever we need him to do and does it extremely well," Smith said. "Having someone that's a Swiss Army Knife like that opens up so

many possibilities."

Leftwich moved into the role of starting running back after Sweatman suffered a season-ending knee injury. Sweatman averaged 105.7 rushing yards per game before his injury, which included an all-star performance of 327 rushing yards and four touchdowns against Wilkes Central.

Smith said Sweatman is on track to suit up for his senior season.

"Coach Daniel Draughn modified his training around his knee rehab and Zamarri never stopped training," Smith said. "He got cleared over the summer and we've been easing him back into it. We know what Zamarri can do. He's starting to look like himself again."

Kyler Cain will also get reps at running back as he returns from a knee injury as well.

Leftwich was able to move to running back in 2024 as North had a loaded, senior-heavy group of wide receivers as well as a veteran quarterback. Leftwich returns as the leading receiver, but only one other returning player had more than 100

receiving yards a season ago. The Greyhounds will also be led by a new quarterback - Cade Atkins.

Atkins played JV as a sophomore but missed his junior season with an

"Cade has every physical tool needed to succeed at that position," Smith said. "He's 6-foot-2, about 190 pounds and is a really talented athlete; we want to use his athleticism to our advantage. Naturally he'll have to overcome the learning curve on some things having missed a season, but as coaches it's our job to put him in a position to be successful."

In addition to Leftwich, Smith highlighted Beau Carson, David Schuyler, Jace Euart and Douglas Sykes as some of the team's wideouts. The coach also plans to use multiple tight ends at times, with those including Jaxton Turney, Parker Dunbar and Erik Cabrera.

The Greyhounds' offensive line situation is still an open competition.

Smith mentioned numerous players that could help fill those spots, such as: Wyatt Hooker, Dillon Shore, Ben Lakey, Dodger Hodges, Brody Anderson, Hayden Mosley and Gabe Chamberlain.

Austin Ravit is North's only returning starter on the defensive line.

"He's going to have to step up and fill that role Uriah had last season," Smith said. "He's got great hands, great hips and great bend for a guy over 300 pounds. He's had a great offseason and been part of that senior group of leaders."

Hooker, Shore and Turney will also make waves on the defensive line, though Turney may be used at linebacker at times.

Cabrera returns as North's leading tackler from a season ago. He also led the Hounds in tackles as a sophomore before suffering an injury.

Cabrera and Gage Combs will start at linebacker.

"Those guys are very familiar with what we run and have a lot of experience," Smith said. "They've

helped us install a lot more than we had at this time last year."

Leftwich was an all-conference defensive back as a junior but will be used as both a linebacker and cornerback, depending on the situation, to make an impact in more areas on defense.

North returns both safeties in Schuyler and Cain. Schuyler is a multi-time all-conference selection on defense and is one of the senior leaders on the varsity squad.

Damarcus McClure is expected to make an impact at cornerback, as will Carson and Elijah Jenkins. Smith said the new core of defensive backs will open things up to bring Leftwich into the box.

BIG GAMES

North Surry, which now competes in the 4A Division, looks to qualify for state playoffs for the third-straight season.

"We're proud of the kids for the work they've done, and we're really excited to get going," Smith said.

North Surry will face former Foothills 2A Conference opponents West Wilkes and North Wilkes as part of a five-game nonconference slate. The Hounds have won their past two meetings with each of those Wilkes squads, including a 34-28 overtime win over West Wilkes this past October. North will also take on Alleghany for the first time since 2019.

The Greyhounds will take a detour to Virginia to take on Patrick County, then will wrap up nonconference play against Northwood.

"We just want to control the controllables," Smith said when asked about what he's looking for in the first few weeks of the season. "That's what we preach to the kids every day. It doesn't matter how tall you are, big you are, if you've started however many years, whatever. We can control our attitude and toughness, and once we establish that we can see where we are."



Wall led the Eagles' defense with more than 140 total tackles and 20 tackles for loss. He was the Eagles' only all-conference selection on defense, but the team graduated 10 of its 12 leading tacklers from a year ago. Jewell, Snow and Johnson combined for five of the team's seven interceptions, while seniors also contributed to four of the six forced fumbles.

Offensively, Jewell was the starting quarterback for the better part of three years, throwing for more than 1,500 yards and 20 touchdowns in 2024. Huffman approached nearly 900 rushing yards, including five 100-yard games, while Williams led the team in all-purpose yards with more than 1,500 as a split wide receiver and running back.

Williams, who was named specialist of the year for the conference, scored three touchdowns on special teams to bring his season total up to 17; he will continue his football career at N.C. Wesleyan University. McMillen was the team's top receiver with nearly 700 yards and 10 touchdowns and also served as the kicker.

The Eagles graduated almost all their starters on both the offensive and defensive lines.

SEASON OUTLOOK

Surry Central's football program will start with a clean slate in 2025. Not only did the Golden Eagles graduate 16 seniors, but the team will also be led by a new head coach for the first time in nearly two decades.

Jamie Fortner took over the program in January after longtime coach Monty Southern stepped down. The former North Stokes coach is ready for a fresh start with a young Eagles squad.

"I'm really enjoying it here at Surry Central," Fortner said. "I've enjoyed working with these boys because they



work hard, they're physical and they want to be successful. These guys are here to lay the foundation that's going to make us a program to contend with."

The young Eagles currently have just 13 upperclassmen on the roster. The program does boast large freshmen and sophomore classes.

Central returns three starters on offense: Travon Sawyers, Micah

Whitley and Preston Hall.

Sawyers will operate as the primary quarterback after playing receiver and defensive back in 2024. He will be joined by Will Pardue, who Fortner said will compete for some time at quarterback while also playing receiver.

"We've really been tickled with both of those guys," Fortner said. "They're both great athletes and both have a lot of strengths we want to utilize."

Sawyers may also play some slot receiver if Pardue lines up under center. Sawyers is the only returning Central player that caught a pass on varsity last year, grabbing five receptions for 130 yards (26 YPR) and two touchdowns.

Konner Jordan, Easton Byrd and transfer Eli Martin will also play receiver for the Eagles.

The Eagles will operate with a two back set and utilize split backs out of the gun. Hayden Wood is someone Fortner said had a great offseason and will be a powerful force. Adam Deyab and Micah Whitley will also serve as running backs.

Senior Preston Hall returns as the Golden Eagles' only starter on the offensive line. He will line up alongside players such as Bryson Wilson, JJ Longworth, Ezequiel Rayo-Cruz, Levi Seiber and Hunter Tolbert.

"I think we'll be able to go six or seven deep on the OL," Fortner said.

Many of the players on the offensive line will pull double duty in the trenches on defense. Hall, once again, is the only returning starter on the d-line and may line up next to defensive ends Wood and Rayo-Cruz, nose guards Wilson and Longworth, and Seiber will be used as a threetechnique player.

Surry Central graduated 10 of its 12 leading tacklers from the 2024 season. The only exceptions were Whitley at linebacker and Sawyers at defensive back.

Whitley had a breakout sophomore season as one of the Foothills 2A Conference's leaders in total tackles. Whitley led the team with five sacks

and was second with 117 total tackles and 16 tackles for a loss. He also had a forced fumble and two fumble recoveries.

Whitley will operate as an inside linebacker alongside Deyab, while Branch will be one of the team's outside linebackers.

Sawyers, who returns at safety, was one of three Eagles to grab multiple interceptions this past season. He also finished with 45 total tackles.

Pardue will play safety alongside Sawyers, while Martin, Jordan and Landon Davis will play cornerback.

BIG GAMES

Central opens the season against three opponents it defeated in 2024: Elkin, North Wilkes and West Wilkes. However, Fortner isn't concerned about what the Eagles accomplished this past season but is instead focused on how his young team will react when faced with adversity.

The nonconference portion of Central's schedule will be very telling for the coach.

"How are we going to react when things don't go our way or we go down by a couple of touchdowns," Fortner said. "These guys have done everything I've asked them to do. Our conditioning has been huge, so hopefully when we get to the fourth quarter of some of these games we can continue to work hard and keep up our physicality."

A Sept. 12 game at South Stokes begins Surry Central's month away from Dobson. The Eagles play back-toback road games at South and Trinity, have their bye week then play on the road again in the conference opener against East Surry.

The new Northwest 3A/4A Conference will surely test Central, but Fortner said that's a long way away and that his team is focused solely on Week One.

Five of the six conference teams made the playoffs last year, and three of those - East Surry, Mount Airy and West Stokes – won at least one playoff game.




Football is back in the Granite City and the Mount Airy Bears are ready to make an impact in the 3A division.

position players on offense but has a noticeable opening at quarterback - a position that was occupied by a Gallimore each of the past four years.

Taylor said there have been three contenders for the quarterback position in the offseason: Ahmad Francis, Aidan Pomerov and Ty Hemric. Francis is a freshman transfer, Hemric is a sophomore that played quarterback for the JV squad in 2024, and Pomeroy previously served as backup varsity quarterback. Taylor said all three bring unique skillsets to the table that Mount Airy can utilize.

The Bears averaged more than 300 rushing yards per game this past season while passing for just over 40 yards per game. Taylor said the Bears will take a more mixed approach this season under new offensive coordinator Tanner Hiatt.

Former Northwest 1A Conference Offensive Player of the Year Taeshon Martin returns for his senior year. Martin had one of the best seasons in school history in 2024 by averaging 171.2 rushing yards per game. He ran 224 times for nearly 2,400 yards, averaged more than 10 yards per carry and scored 41 total touchdowns.

Martin won't have to carry as much as he did as a junior due to more depth on this year's roster but will remain a focal point of the offense. Taylor mentioned getting Martin more involved in the passing game while also incorporating running backs such as Kylan Mason, Braddox Sumner and Tymere Brown. Mason averaged 7.9 vards per carry off 32 touches as a sophomore, while Sumner and Brown

primarily played JV.

Mount Airy's second-leading rusher from a year ago, DJ Joyce, will likely take a reduced role on offense. Joyce, who ran for 711 yards and 13 touchdowns this past season, suffered a serious knee injury during basketball season but was medically cleared in July. Joyce will make his biggest impact on the defensive line.

Zach Goins returns as the Bears' leading receiver. Goins accounted for 357 of the team's 591 receiving yards and five of seven receiving touchdowns. Saul Oakley, Karson Strickland and Jasper Wilmoth will join Goins as wideouts, while Martin and Mason will be used as dual threat players.

The Bears' offensive line took a big hit by graduating Dawkins, Hill and Harper.

Former all-conference player Jackson Byerly, who stands 6-foot-6 and 246 pounds, will line up as the team's right tackle, while the 6'4" 260-pound Riley Leake will start at right guard. McKennon Hiatt returns as the team's 6'3" 240-pound center.

Carson Soriano and Ethan Clabo are two newcomers to the line, at least in their current roles. Soriano, a 6'0" 263-pound sophomore who spent most of the 2024 season on JV, will start at left guard. Clabo took advantage of his 6'4" 225-pound frame last season as a tight end but will start this season at left tackle.

Clabo will resume his starting job as a defensive end as well. He and Joyce combined for 88 tackles for a loss and

31.5 sacks. Joyce led the state with 57 tackles for a loss and set a new school record with 19 sacks (in the MaxPreps era, via Mount Airy sports historian Doug McDaniel).

Third Floyd also returns for his fourth varsity season on the defensive line. The 6'1" 327-pound Floyd is deceptively quick and was a crucial part of a defense that allowed just nine PPG in 2024.

Taylor said the Bears plan to fill Dawkins' role by committee for the time being.

Caudle was the Bears' leading tackler in 2024, but the team returns seven of its next 10 leading tacklers three of which will return as starting linebackers: Mason, Oakley and Tyson Youmans. Youmans had 104 tackles this past season, and Mason and Oakley weren't far behind at 88 and 80 respectively.

Martin returns at safety, while Goins and Karson Strickland return as cornerbacks. Martin had three interceptions and 12 pass deflections a year ago, and Goins added eight pass deflections. Strickland was one of five Bears that forced multiple fumbles.

Taylor said the remaining safety spot is up for grabs with players such as Pomeroy, Hemric and Sumner in the running.

BIG GAMES

Mount Airy's ascent into the 3A division brings with it one of the Bears' toughest regular season schedules in

Mount Airy jumps headfirst into the deep end in Week 1 by hosting former Northwest 1A Conference rival Starmount. The Bears handed the Rams their only two losses in 2024 by scores of 17-14 and 31-23, the latter of which came in the third round of the state playoffs.

"We really want to start fast," Taylor said. "It seems that in the past few seasons it's taken us some time to settle into that first game, and we had to make adjustments. That's one of the reasons we went to Mount Tabor to prepare. Starmount's a great program so we can't afford to start slow."

Mount Airy then takes on another team that won 10 games in 2024, East

Season Outlook

Coming off a successful 10-3 season, the East Wilkes Cardinals enter 2025 with high expectations but a measured approach under head coach Travis Walker.

The Cardinals, who made significant strides last year, face the challenge of replacing graduated talent while maintaining the momentum from their most successful campaign in recent memory.

"The expectations this year, coming off a 10-3 year, are fairly high for this team," Walker said. "With that being said, we have to realize that last year's team was last year's group, and this is a new year for us. My expectation is for us to get better each and every week, as well as play with great effort. We must take each game at a time and not look ahead to anyone."

East Wilkes will compete in a restructured conference this season, featuring familiar faces that should create compelling matchups throughout the year.

"We feel good about this new conference because it is familiar to us," Walker explained. "It's like the old MVAC and has some natural rivalries in it. Everyone is familiar with one another, a lot of the same teams that we play anyway, so it should make it an interesting conference."

Walker identifies speed, particularly in the backfield, as the Cardinals' primary strength heading into the season. However, questions remain about the offensive line's ability to create opportunities for those playmakers.

"I feel like our team strength is overall speed, especially in our backfield, but our guys up front still have to block for them and get them going," Walker said. "I wouldn't say our OL is a weakness, but kind of an unknown right now. Within the last week, we have had to plug in a few guys, due to some circumstances, and that is now a wait-and-see situation to see if they can get it done. I feel like they can, but they also

must believe it themselves."

The Cardinals return three experienced players who will anchor both sides of the ball and have garnered college attention.

Austin Nash and Reece Dobbins return as three-year starters in the backfield and on defense, bringing veteran leadership and proven production. Ayden Guessford, a twoyear starter at B-back and three-year defensive starter, rounds out the trio of impact players.

Nash rushed for 649 yards and nine touchdowns while adding 252 receiving yards and three receiving scores. Nash's 13 total touchdowns ranked second on the team behind Blackburn's 15.

Guessford recorded 509 yards rushing with nine touchdowns, while Dobbins gained 427 yards in the backfield with four touchdowns.

Defensively, Guessford returns with a team-leading 109 tackles. Nash registered 63 tackles, and senior Brady Shore was fifth on the team with





The following graduates were part of either the offensive or defensive lines: Reece, Hernandez, Jester, Marler, Lucas Pettit and Jake Pettit.


SEASON OUTLOOK

Walkertown won eight games and advanced to the second round of the state playoffs in 2024 after going 3-7 in 2023.

With Garcia taking over as quarterback, former Falcons QB Tyler Winters has shifted to wide receiver. Winters was an all-conference player in 2024 that passed for 1,343 yards, nine touchdowns and 12 interceptions. He also rushed 101 times for 285 yards and a touchdown.

Winters looks to bolster a unit that

Linebacker Skylar Kimber paced Forbush in tackles with 79 in 2024. Giovanni Valerio-Real was next with 64 total tackles, followed by Benitez with 59 and Kaleb Bales with 48.

Bales led the Falcons with 11 tackles for a loss and two sacks as a sophomore. Valerio-Real and Benitez combined for Forbush's three total interceptions, while Benitez, Kimber and Ian Brewer combined for four of the team's six fumble recoveries.

BIG GAMES

Forbush looks to make the playoffs for the first time since 2021. The 2024 Falcons performed well at home, going

3-2, but went 0-5 in road games. The Falcons were outscored 221-44 on the road.



a two-way lineman after starting as a freshman, while sophomore tight end/ linebacker Zach Taitt (5-10, 195) brings back seven receptions from 2024.

North Stokes managed just 126.2 yards per game of total offense in 2024 while allowing 340.9 yards defensively. The offensive line presents the biggest question mark, lacking both experience and depth.

"We're inexperienced in some key areas, particularly along the offensive line," Bullington said. "Depth is also a concern there, so keeping that group healthy and continuing to develop them will be critical."

The Vikings return leading rusher Gavin Hernandez, who gained 626 yards and scored one touchdown in 2024.

Junior Jackson Bodenhamer, a 6-foot, 190-pound multi-sport athlete, led the team in receptions and yards during 7-on-7 competition and could make an immediate impact at receiver.

Senior Isaac Hicks makes his varsity debut at defensive end after impressing

coaches with his 435-pound squat tops on the team. Freshman Nate. Harrison (6-0, 180) could contribute at tight end and linebacker.

Other players to watch are Wyatt Collins (Jr.), a returner on both sides of the ball; Jackson Bodenhamer (Jr.), a multi-sport athlete who led the team in receptions during the team's 7-on-7 competitions this summer; and Alex Brown (Jr.), another returner on both sides of the ball.

Bullington believes his team's commitment to improvement will translate to better results on the field in the new conference alignment.

"We're excited about the new conference," he said. "It's going to be competitive, we believe we have a great shot to contend for the conference championship. It'll come down to who can stay focused, stay healthy, and execute week in and week out."

As North Stokes prepares for the upcoming season, Bullington's emphasis on building a culture of discipline and accountability appears to have taken root with his players, setting the stage for what he hopes will be a more competitive showing in their new

conference home.

BIG GAMES

Starting the season 1-0 is a big game for anyone, and the Vikings will look to secure that win at home against Cherryville, who finished 3-8 last season. Another game circled on the calendar is out-of-state rival Patrick County, Va., during week four. Other

notable games are against Chatham Central, who the Vikings beat last year 20-8, South Davidson, which was the other win North Stokes earned, and of course, county-rival South Stokes in the last game of the season.

Key Losses

The Wildcats face a complete offensive overhaul heading into the

2025 season after graduating their top four offensive producers, including quarterback Sam Reeves and leading rusher Lindann Fleming.

Fleming's departure represents the most significant loss for the Wildcats. The senior tailback rushed for 1,427 yards and 21 touchdowns while averaging 129.7 yards per game. He also led the team in total offense with 1,801 yards and topped all scorers with 140 points on 23 total touchdowns.

West Stokes must also find a new signal-caller after losing Reeves, who completed 98 of 189 passes for 1,507 yards and 15 touchdowns. The senior quarterback added 121 rushing yards and accounted for 1,628 total yards of offense.

Senior running back Aydden Cherry, who rushed for 749 yards and 12 touchdowns while adding 29 catches for 304 yards, also graduated. His 1,128 total yards of offense ranked second on the team behind Fleming.

The receiving corps takes a major hit with the loss of Derek Studer, who caught 16 passes for 371 yards and five touchdowns while averaging 23.2 yards per reception. Other departing receivers include Mikah Webster (159 receiving yards, two TDs) and return specialist contributors.

The defensive side faces equally challenging losses, led by linebacker Daniel Stanley. The senior recorded 116 total tackles, including 65 solo stops, to rank second on the team in tackles.

Jackson Roscoe (71 tackles) and Jonah McCoy (67 tackles) also graduated, along with Noah Wilkinson (48 tackles). The four seniors combined for 302 tackles, representing a significant portion of the team's defensive production.

Perhaps the most critical area needing attention is special teams, where the Wildcats lose their entire kicking game with the graduation of Specialist of the Year, Myles Knox.

Knox handled both placekicking and punting duties, converting 47 of 51 extra points (92.2 percent) and seven of 11 field goal attempts (63.6 percent). As a punter, he averaged 34.0 yards on 31 attempts for 1,053 total yards.



The senior kicker contributed 68 points to the team's scoring total, averaging 5.2 points per game.

West Stokes graduated eight offensive starters, including offensive lineman Jordan Cave, Luke Whitt (Wingate University), Kyle Sellers (Greensboro College), and Jackson Sammons (transferred to Grimsley High School), losing over 3,000 yards of total offense and more than 300 points of scoring production.

Season Outlook

West Stokes enters 2025 facing significant roster turnover and the challenge of developing inexperienced

players in a new, more competitive conference.

The Wildcats' offensive hopes rest largely on senior Nate Akers, who emerged as a reliable dualthreat weapon in 2024. Akers caught 29 passes for 425 yards and five touchdowns while adding 41 rushing yards and one score. He also contributed 122 total tackles on defense, showcasing his versatility and football instincts.

Junior Devan Gastley returns with defensive experience (52 total tackles) but is also the likely candidate for taking over for Reeves at quarterback.

Several role players return with potential for larger contributions, including seniors Charlie Reeves (3 catches, 57 yards) and Micah Long, juniors Jah'mari Morris, who showed flashes as a kick returner (206 yards on 7 returns), Dallas Frasher, Omari Graham, and Dalton East.

Sophomore Cole Knox, who appeared in four games and completed all four pass attempts for 84 yards, could factor into the quarterback competition with Gastley.

"We have a lot of players with little to no varsity playing experience, but they are very talented and understand how to work hard," Head Coach Trent Lowman said. "We have to get better every day and stay the course no matter what the outcome."

The team's primary challenge will be replacing the production of graduated seniors, who accounted for the majority of the team's offensive statistics and defensive leadership. The Wildcats must develop depth and experience quickly while maintaining the competitive standard established last season.

West Stokes transitions to a new conference alignment, which Lowman views positively, despite the increased competition.

"It's a beast of a league, but it's great for everyone to play against schools without driving 90 minutes or more to get there," he said. "It's easier for families, cheaper for schools, and



just makes sense. There's a lot of wins, championships, and deep runs over the years from teams out of this league. I can see a few teams from our conference making runs in the playoffs each season."

Lowman identifies athleticism in key positions and overall team size as primary strengths, along with the

KEY LOSSES

The Sauras must replace their entire offensive leadership, including quarterback Connor Cox, who completed 123 of 252 passes for 1,265 yards and 10 touchdowns while maintaining a 48.8% completion rate.

The most significant loss comes with the transfer of junior Keymani Brown, who led the team with 533 rushing yards and four touchdowns on 117 carries, averaging 4.6 yards per attempt and 53.3 yards per game.

Senior Parker Barron, who graduates after serving as the team's top receiver with 36 catches for 448 yards and three touchdowns, also handled the kicking duties with a 10-of-12 success rate on extra points.

Senior Desian Leeper provided a consistent deep threat with 13 receptions for 206 yards and two touchdowns, averaging 15.8 yards per catch. His brother, Dezjerian Leeper, contributed 563 return yards and one touchdown on special teams while adding defensive versatility.

Additional offensive departures include senior Amari Conrad, who rushed for 253 yards and caught 14

passes, and senior Justin Joyce, who provided depth in the backfield and receiving corps.

Senior Elijah Tyler, who recorded three receiving touchdowns and contributed 289 receiving yards on 26 catches, will focus on soccer instead of returning to football.

The defensive losses are equally substantial, beginning with Barron, who led the team with 84 total tackles, including 59 solo stops and 25 assists.

Joyce ranked second with 66 total tackles, while senior Bryce Epperson contributed 45 tackles from his position. Senior Elijah Tilley added 37 tackles and provided pass rush with one sack.

Senior Dalton Hutchings anchored the line with 26 tackles, while senior BJ Gray, despite limited playing time, recorded 31 tackles and contributed on special teams before not playing in 2024.

SEASON OUTLOOK

South Stokes football coach Josh Mickey doesn't sugarcoat the challenge ahead for his Sauras squad in 2025.

After finishing 1-10 overall and 1-5 in Northwest 1A Conference play last

season, South Stokes faces the task of rebuilding with a roster that lost 10 key seniors to graduation.

"We're in a rebuilding year, there's no question about that," said Mickey. "We lost a lot of experience and leadership with those 12 seniors, but that creates opportunities for our younger players to step up and make their mark."

The Sauras struggled offensively in 2024, averaging just 177 yards per game while allowing 363.1 yards to opponents. The team only managed 122 points in 11 games, compared to 491 allowed.

Among the notable departures are the team's top offensive contributors from last season. The coaching staff will need to find new playmakers to fill significant voids in both the running and passing games.

"Last season was tough, but it taught us a lot about what we need to work on," Mickey said. "We need to get back to fundamentals and build from the ground up. The kids who are coming back have seen what it takes, and they're hungry to prove themselves."

The offensive attack will be led by freshman quarterback Luke Amos, who Mickey expects to make an

immediate impact despite his youth.

Jamison Canty returns after catching 13 passes for 127 yards and two touchdowns while also handling punting duties with a 29.0-yard average on 42 attempts. Blaine Ellis recorded 32 total tackles (22 solo, 10 assists) with one pass deflection, Elijah Wright tallied 18 total tackles with two pass deflections, Michael Brown contributed 19 total tackles on defense, and Sawyer Scott made 17 tackles and averaged 2.9 yards on seven kickoff returns.

Other players to watch include senior lineman Caden Hart, who Mickey believes "has a chance to have a good season on both sides of the ball," and safety/running back Tucker Monday. Monday missed the 2024 season with a broken collarbone but is expected to be fully healthy for the upcoming campaign.

Wide receiver/defensive back Nick Turner returns after catching one pass for 13 yards last season. Despite limited production, Mickey sees potential in both Monday and Turner.

"Tucker will be a very physical player for us on defense and Turner has good hands and is very knowledgeable of our offensive scheme," Mickey said.

The Sauras will benefit from a new conference alignment, which Mickey views as an opportunity for improvement. North Carolina high school athletics underwent a major realignment for the 2025-29 cycle, with the NCHSAA expanding to eight classifications.

"I'm very excited for the new conference," Mickey said. "I think everyone in our conference will be competitive and it should be a fun year."

Mickey believes his team's secondary will be its greatest strength, while acknowledging the challenges ahead in rebuilding other areas of the roster.

"We feel our skill positions will be good for us this year," Mickey said. "Our secondary should be the strength of our team."

The Sauras open the 2025 season looking to improve on last year's lone victory, which came against North Stokes in a thrilling 22-21 conference win. With youth throughout the lineup and a new conference structure,

"Austin and Reece are three-year starters in the backfield as well as on defense. Ayden is a twoyear starter at the B back position as well as a threeyear starter on defense," Walker noted. "Those three are getting some college looks, and we are expecting big things from them."

Big Games

players' desire to succeed. However, the lack of varsity experience remains the team's biggest concern as young players adjust to the speed and physicality of high school football.

The Wildcats return minimal offensive production from 2024's unit that averaged 312.8 yards per game, creating opportunities for emerging players to establish themselves while putting pressure on the coaching staff to develop multiple options at skill positions.

Defensively, West Stokes mustreplace significant tackle production, though returning players like Akers and Gastley provide a foundation to build upon.

With proper development and the work ethic Lowman emphasizes, the Wildcats possess the talent to remain

competitive, though growing pains are expected as the roster gains necessary experience throughout the season.

Big Games

The Wildcats play a brutal nonconference schedule with a season opener at North Davidson and then travel to county-rival South Stokes in week two and will try and extend their four-game winning streak over the Sauras. Other non-conference games include Northeast Guilford, Community School of Davidson, and Statesville.

The new Northwest 3A/4A Conference makes all games big games for the Wildcats with natural rivalries already formed. West Stokes will play Mount Airy for the first time since 2019, and renew rivalries against East Surry, North Surry, and Surry Central.
