

# Pastor Appreciation 2025

How then shall they call on him in whom they have not believed? and how shall they believe in him of whom they have not heard? and how shall they hear without a preacher? Romans 10:14 (KJV)

Why is it appropriate to set aside a special time each year to give recognition and affirmation to our clergy and their families? How are their needs and circumstances different from those of carpenters, grocers or dentists?

One distinction lies in the nature of the service these leaders provide. God has entrusted to them one of the most precious of assignments- the spiritual well-being of His flock. When a pastor becomes ineffective, the very souls of his or her parishioners are endangered.

When eternity is in the balance, we should all be concerned. Another problem lies in the expectations placed on pastors. Numerous surveys have found that a very high percentage of pastors feel pressure to be the ideal role model of a Christian family-which is impossible, of course. As a result, four out of five pastors feel their families are negatively impacted by unrealistic expectations-whether self-imposed or congregation imposed-and that ministry is an outright hazard to the health of their families. Indeed, the "pedestal" is not all it's cracked up to be.

As pastors and their families try to please the God who called them to ministry while also trying to meet the expectations of their congregations, one result is dangerous stress. In fact, 75 percent of those surveyed reported experiencing a significant stress-related crisis at least once in their ministry. Then, of course, there is the "fishbowl" aspect of ministry, whereby the entire lives of pastoral families seem to be on public display. Every private family situation quickly seems to become a congregational or community issue. This anxiety can only be heightened when financial pressures also come to bear, which is common since pastors typically make substantially less each year than their own board members and deacons.

Nearly 70 percent of pastoral spouses work outside the home, most often due to financial need. No one would choose to live life under these conditions unless they felt obliged to a higher, divine directive. Unfortunately, all too often, these are exactly the conditions under which pastoral families serve. The good news is that we can make a difference! Pastor Appreciation Month is an attempt to counter the negative erosion in the lives of our spiritual leaders with positive affirmation.

## Job repents and God restores

At the close of the Book of Job, Eliphaz, Bildad, and Zophar finished their speeches condemning Job of hiding some secret sin. Job was encountering a series of questions given by God to open the eyes of Job's understanding about the sovereignty of God.

During this questioning, a severe thunderstorm was approaching. The dropping air temperature in the wind was causing gusts that probably made the men seek shelter. Rain began pouring. Lightening was flashing amidst the loud thunder. It was during this storm God's powerful voice was heard by Job, which possibly was heard by Job's friends. Not only was Job humbled by the experience, but also his friends were beginning to "feel" the wrath of God for not speaking truthfully about Job.

Job repented of his lack of understanding to the ways of God, and his friends were confronted of their lack of understanding and compassion due to self-righteous pride.

Notice these interesting verses from Job 42:5-6, "And Job said, 'I have heard of You by the hearing of the ear, but now my eye sees you; therefore I abhor myself, and repent in dust and ashes."

This passage makes one wonder if Job and his friends had seen some type of glorious form arising from the storm clouds that gave the appearance of a heavenly being? Could they have heard the thundering voice of God audibly that would have caused them to shiver in His presence? At this point, not one of Job's friends gave any more comments, but Job did have the manner of humility and repentance in the presence of a mighty God.

During this experience, Job admitted that he did not understand the wisdom and ways of God. He realized that God had the power and wisdom to bring order and healing to that which had been chaotic and painful. His head knowledge about God sank down into a heart knowledge about a wise and powerful God that was in control of his life. Then, Job learned that he did not have to understand everything that happened in his life, he just needed to trust God.

Notice the passage from Job 42:7-8, "And it was so, that after the Lord had spoken these words unto Job, the Lord said to Eliphaz the Temanite, 'My wrath is kindled against thee, and against thy two friends: for ye have not spoken of me the thing that is right, as my servant Job hath. 'Therefore take unto you now seven bullocks and seven rams, and go to my servant Job, and offer up for yourselves a burnt offering; and my servant Job shall pray for you: for him will I accept: lest I deal with you after your folly, in that ye have not spoken of me the thing which is right, like my servant Job."

The verbal chastisement of Eliphaz and his friends was not pleasant for them to hear. First of all, they learned that their self-righteous pride was not acceptable to a holy God. God did not want to hear their prayers until an offering, an expensive sacrifice, would be offered by Job. (The same kind of offering that Job gave for the intercession for his children.) Second, Eliphaz and his friends were ordered to find those animals from someone's flock,

pay for them, then give them to Job for intercession. That sacrifice cost them deeply from their own resources.

Job's healing took place when he interceded for his friends. Not only was his health restored, but also twice the wealth in gold, silver, and livestock. His influence in the community was also doubly restored. Job and his wife also obtained seven more sons and three more daughters. (Including his first set of ten children who were in heaven, in the presence of God, his amount of children had doubled.) Job's relationship with God, no doubt was stronger than ever. His faith in the midst of trials was rewarded. Thus, serving as a guide for us to follow, that in the midst of our own trials, allow our own faith to grow, because God is a powerful God.

# Handling adversity

We live in a world affected by the curse of sin. As a result of sin's negative intrusion into our lives, there are times when we must face adversity. It can be sickness, death, job loss, financial struggles, family issues, and the list goes on. There is a misunderstanding that just


because a person is a child of God that no adversity will come their way. Such teaching is false. When you read through the Bible, you will discover the people of God having to face adverse situations from time to time.

One example of facing an adverse situation is found in Acts 27. Paul is being sent to Rome as a prisoner. Boarding a huge ship, Paul and the other passengers set sail for what he hopes to be a trouble-free trip. However, soon after setting sail, they face a huge storm. The storm is so destructive that eventually the ship is completely destroyed.

Thankfully, though, all the passengers arrive safely to shore at an island called Malta.

The storm is representative of the times in our lives when we face adversity that seems destructive. One truth we need to remember when storms arise, God is still in control, and He never loses anyone who belongs to Him. I want to share with you five practices from this text that we need to engage in or follow when we face adversity.

We need to practice prayer. In verse 21 Paul goes away by himself for a while. When he returns, he has a word from the Lord. When we face adverse situations, we need to get alone with the Lord. We must not do all the talking but allow the Lord to speak to us. We need to listen for His voice though the Bible or that still small voice of the Holy Spirit down in our heart and soul. His words will be words whereby we can find comfort, peace

and instruction in how to handle the situation. Prayers will truly make a difference in how we deal with adversity.

We need to practice trusting God's promises. In verse 23 God had spoken to Paul and assured him that all would be safe. In the Bible the Lord has given us so many promises. We can know God's promises to be trustworthy, because His Word tells us in 1 Kings 8:56 that not one word of His promises has ever failed. When we face adversity, we can know that "He will not leave us" and "that He will go before us." We can take comfort in knowing that just as Jesus promised Peter in Luke 22:32, "He has prayed for us". So, we need to practice trusting the promises of the Lord.

We need to practice patience. When you read this story in Acts the sailors wanted to take some action on their own. They began to loose the lifeboat in verse 30 and were preparing to slip away on their own. Paul said to the captain, "Tell these men if they do this, they are not promised safety." I know that when storms of adversity arise in our lives, we have the tendency to take matters into our own hands and try to handle the situation in our way. What we need to do is practice waiting on the Lord to provide the solution His way and to reveal to us the action He wants us to follow. I know it is difficult, but when adversity visits us, wait for the Lord to provide directions.


We must practice performance. I know this may sound like a contradiction, but often when adversity comes, we sit down on the Lord. We must know there is time to wait and there is time for action. When God reveals to us His action plan in times of adversity, we need to obey. If you notice in verses 32 and 38 the men "cut the ropes" and threw their cargo overboard to lighten the ship. They did what they knew they had to do.

When adversity comes, be patient, but when God reveals a plan of action, get busy and obey Him.

We need to practice praise. We read in verse 44 that after the ship blew apart all the people made it safely to shore just as the Lord had promised. I believe Paul gave praise to the Lord. When the waves of adversity are swirling all around us, the Bible tells us in 1 Thessalonians 5: 18 that we should praise God "in all things." "In all things" means that, while no one desires to go through a storm, we can give praise for the Lord's presence, promises, and provisions even amid the storm. There is a song that says, "Even in the valley, God is good." I am truly thankful that even when the storms of adversity blow into our lives God is still on the throne, and that is a truth for which we can give praise. Even in adverse times God is still good and He deserves our praise.

When storms come into our lives, I encourage us to follow these practices which will help us handle the adversity.




