Lori Byers, Director of the Aging Department explained the increases and summarized the process.
Willard Peterson, from Bradshaw spoke at the hearing in support of the increases.
At 8:53 a.m. the Public Hearing was closed.
Moved and, seconded to approve the increases and set the fares for the York County Transportation as follows, motion carried. (5-0)
Moved and seconded to accept the \$50,000.00 donation to the Aging Department and keep the amount in (2) two separate CDs in the amount of \$25,000.00 each at Midwest Bank, motion carried. (5-0)
John Cannon from Nebraska Association of County Officials along with Senator Hughes spoke to the Board with yearly updates with Legislature bills and laws being passed.
Recess was taken at 9:56 a.m. and came back into session at 10:10 a.m.
Moved and seconded to adopt Resolution #25-21 the certificate of Completion- State wide upgrading existing Stop Sign Location of Rural Roads, motion carried. (5-0)
Moved and seconded to adopt Resolution #25-22, the Counties support for the best use of farmland as crop and livestock production, motion carried. (5-0)
Moved and seconded to accept the Supplemental Agreement P12327-001 with the NDOT and York County for Federal and State Funds to Assist in the provisions of transportation services for the general public, motion carried. (5-0)
Moved and seconded to approve the budget request of \$12,000.00 for the 2025/2026 year from the City of Henderson for the ambulance fee, motion carried. (5-0)
Moved and seconded to postpone making any decisions on the Zoning regulations until the recall proceedings have taken place on Commissioner LeRoy Ott Jr or a new Commissioner has been appointed, motion carried. (4-0)
Recess was taken at 10:43 a.m. and came back into session at 10:52 a.m. with a motion and seconded by to go into executive session to prevent needless injury to an individual, motion carried. (5-0)
Moved and seconded to come out of executive session at 11:22 a.m. where no action was taken, motion carried. (5-0)
Moved and seconded to adopt Resolution #25-23, to accept the recommendation of the elected officials as submitted for the Deputy Clerk, Deputy Treasurer, Deputy County Attorneys, Deputy Clerk of the District Court and change the Deputy Assessor to a 3% increase in hourly wage and to set the Deputy Public Defenders wage when one is hired, motion carried. (5-0)
Moved by and seconded to adopt Resolution #25-24, to set the wage which the County Board set for the Zoning Administrator, motion carried. (4-1)
Moved and seconded to adopt Resolution #25-25 to set the wages which the County Board sets for the Aging/Transportation, Roads, Extension Office, Maintenance, 911 Communications Center and Veterans Clerk, County Employees, motion carried. (5-0)
Moved and seconded, to adopt Resolution #25-26 to set the Department Heads wages, which the County Board set, Highway Superintendent, Communication Director, Maintenance Supervisor, Weed Superintendent, Aging/Transportation Director, Veterans Service Director, and Visitor's Bureau Director, motion carried. (5-0).
A budget workshop was conducted with decreases in the overall asking. The sheriff's Departments budgeted vehicle will come out of inheritance. The wage decrease for employees will have to be recalculated along with retirement and FICA. The Counties reserve will be lowered to \$400,000.00 or lower.
Moved and seconded to budget the same amount that York Adopt a Pet, CASA, York County Development Corporation, Blue Valley Behavioral Health, Blue Valley Community Action, Hope Crisis and the Library requested last year, motion carried. (5-0)
Moved and seconded to accept and make the changes to the budget that were discussed, motion carried. (5-0)
Committee reports were given.
